Make Plans for "Own Your Home" Expo. in Chicago

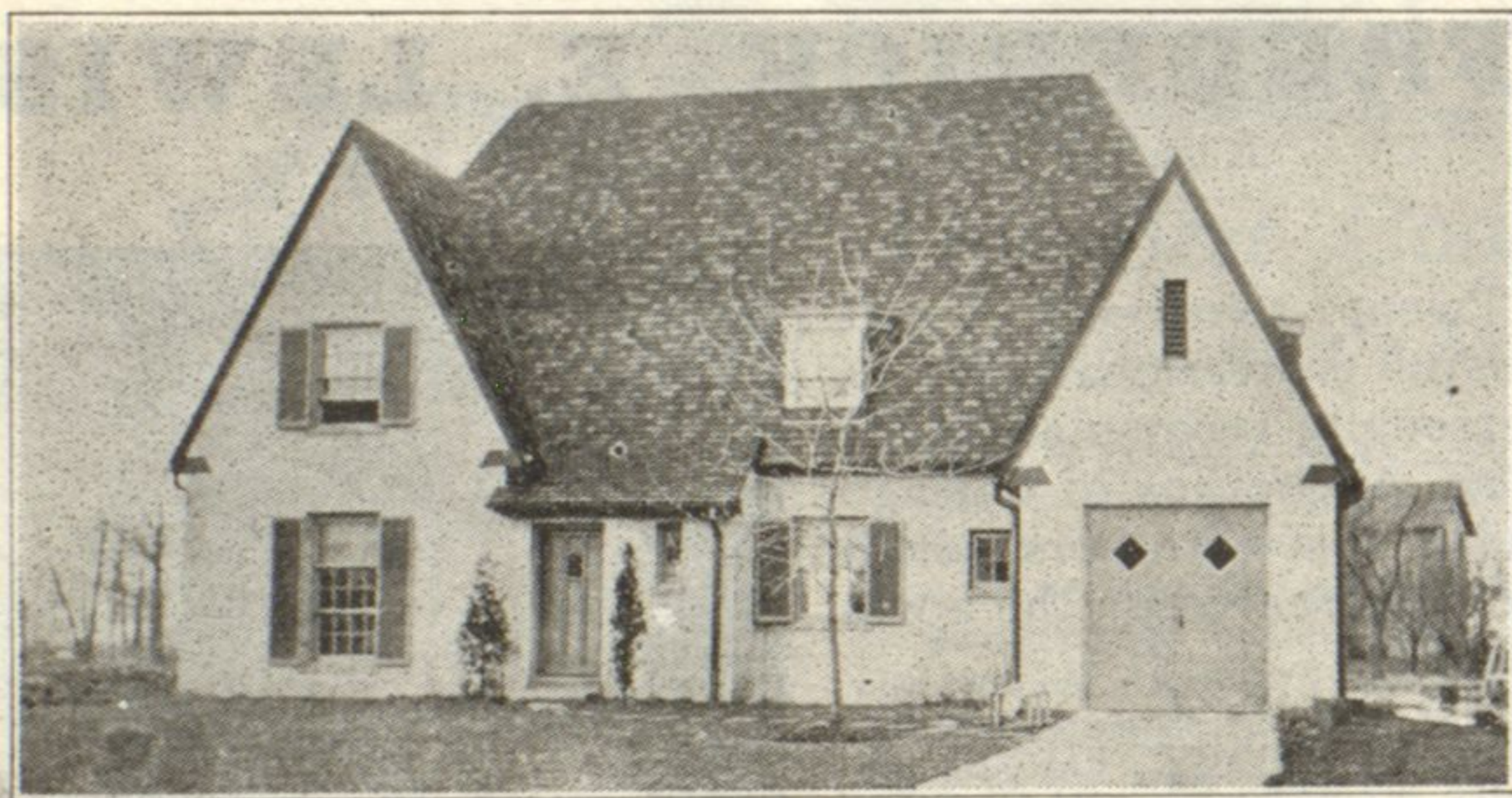
