**Official Count Gives  
New Trier 1,469 Pupils**

A recent count of the students enrolled at New Trier High school indicates a total of 1,469 students. The enrollment is classified as follows:

The freshman class is, as usual, the largest in the school with 241 boys, and 223 girls, a total of 464. The sophomores are second with 198 boys and 204 girls, a total of 402. The junior class numbers 155 boys, and 157 girls, a total of 312. The seniors have 150 boys and 141 girls, 291 in all.

**"Will of Stratford" to Be Staged by Sophomore-Freshman Group at New Trier High School**

The next play to be staged at New Trier High school is the freshman-sophomore production to be given Saturday, March 26. It is "Master Will of Stratford" or "A Midwinter Night's Dream," by Mrs. Eugene H. Garnett, a resident of Evanston. Mrs. Garnett has written only this one play, but she is well known all along the north shore as a poet and musician. She wrote the music for "Master Will of Stratford," which the New Trier orchestra will play at the performance.

The play has three acts, a prologue and an epilogue. The action takes place when William Shakespeare was a little boy in Stratford-on-Avon, on New Year's Eve. In the prologue Will receives permission from his mother to celebrate the occasion by staying up as late as he wants to read his book about fairies, about Titania, Oberon, Puck, and the other fairy characters which appear in "A Midsummer Night's Dream." The three acts are the dream he dreamed after falling asleep over his book.

The dream contains, among others, the fairy characters of "A Midsummer Night's Dream." Events, although they are mixed up enough to have been a real dream, are such that they could have suggested part of the plot of Shakespeare's play. In the epilogue Master Will, waking up the next morning, finds a quill pen on his mother's hearth, where Titania told him he would find his fate.

The important members of the cast are: Master Will Shakespeare, Bill Gobson; Mistress Shakespeare, Betty Funke; Betty, Dorothy Darby; the Peddler, George Cogswell; Titania, Maurine Jones; Oberon, Dorland Davis; Robin Goodfellow, Wilbur Magill; the witch, Jean Thackery; Queen Elizabeth, Mary Louise Cotton; and Sir Thomas Lucy, Carl Hall.
