

Eminent Authority Speaks on Chinese Situation Sunday

Dr. Henry W. Luce, vice president of Peking university, will speak upon the subject, "What Shall We Think of China?" in the neighborhood room of Community House Sunday morning, March 27, at 9:30. The address furnishes an opportunity for all who are interested in the United States' relationship with the nations of the Pacific, to hear the opinions of an authority coming directly from the orient.

Dr. Luce has spent practically all of his life in the development of higher education in China and for two years acted as secretary of the Chinese Educational association and has had exceptional opportunities to study the problem and to observe the changing national situation in all of the main sections of China. In addition, his frequent trips to and from the United States during this period, sometimes crossing Siberia, Russia and Japan, have enabled him to observe and study the important and even serious implications in the international relationships centering on the Pacific.

Dr. Luce speaks under the auspices of the Men's class of the Congregational church and a cordial invitation has been extended to both men and women to attend.
