

PASSAVANT HOSPITAL CITED AS BIG NEED

Head of Northwestern University Medical School Shows Clinic Requirements

Passavant Memorial hospital on the McKinlock campus site of Northwestern university is becoming from week to week a drastically needed institution. According to Dean Irving S. Cutter, head of Northwestern University Medical school, the medical clinic in the Ward Memorial building, cannot function efficiently without a modern hospital adjacent to the clinic.

"The Northwestern Medical clinic started with less than 125 patients a day, self-respecting citizens who through long continued illness or other causes are financially unable to employ a regular physician," explained Dean Cutter. "Now we have as many as 250 out-patients a day,—persons who are ill and who seek our free clinic for proper care and for cure if possible. Many of these patients are hospital cases. Many require, at once, hospital attention and we must send them to a good hospital. The Northwestern Medical clinic is securing excellent co-operation with several hospitals in the city, notably, St. Luke's, Wesley Memorial, Michael Reese, and Cook County. On the other hand, the demand for hospital beds from our clinical patients is

greater than these hospitals can supply, and in this connection Passavant hospital will play a very important part in the proper care of hundreds and thousands of the people of Chicago.

"The Passavant Memorial hospital offers a real investment in humanity. The directors are Chicago citizens of the highest standing and responsibility. They realize that it will be futile to erect an inadequate building, one that in a few months' time would be wholly outgrown. The original amount sought, therefore, must be completed and the additional amount required (\$700,000) should be forthcoming from Chicago philanthropists within the next few weeks. The need is present and urgent. It is confidently anticipated that the well known generosity of Chicago citizens will early complete the quota required."

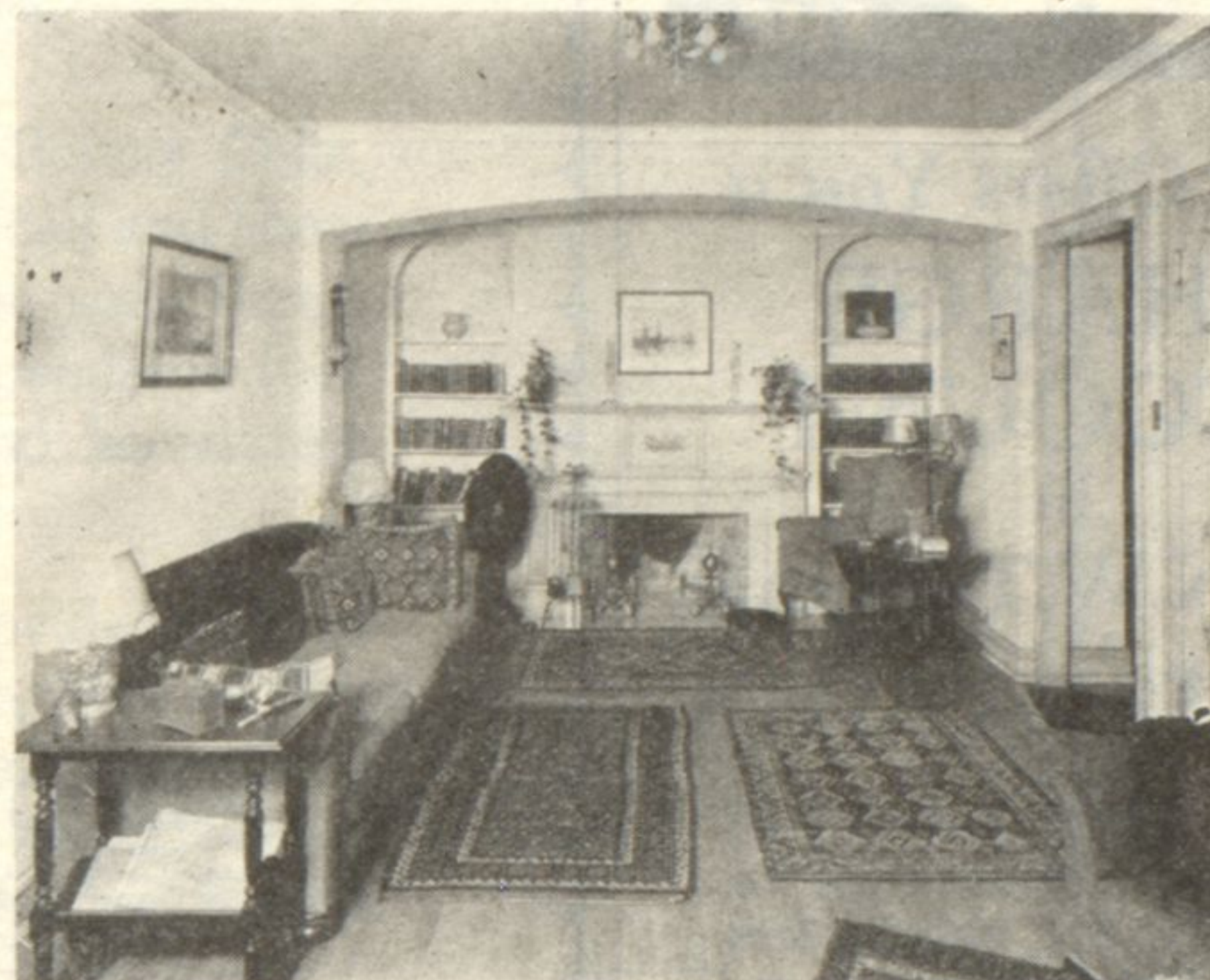

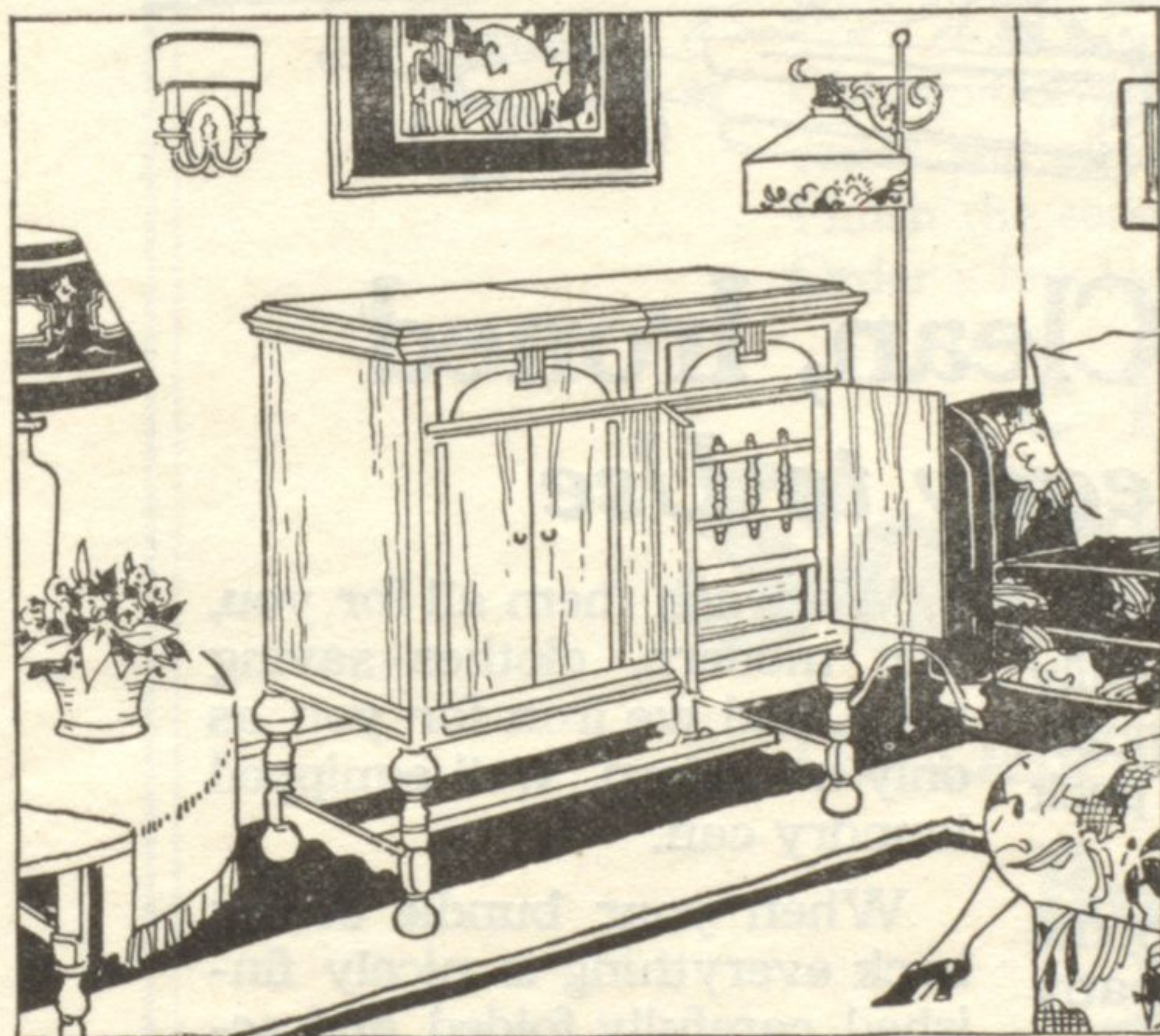
