Three of the Shubert theaters in Chicago are housing very prosperous shows. All three are well worth seeing although each is different from the others in character.

At the Princess, "Ned McCobb's Daughter" has been held over because the box office indicates that the public has taken the critics seriously. In this play, Mr. Sidney Howard shows how a shrewd Yankee mother can outwit even a sophisticated bootlegger when the future of her children is threatened. And what a bootlegger he is. Mr. John Cromwell, who plays the part, is reason enough for a trip to the Princess. The play abounds in thrills, interesting situations and good fun. The entire company is excellent with Miss Florence Johns playing the Yankee mother in a most satisfying manner.

"Katja," a spectacular musical comedy, opened at the Garrick last week. Frederick Lonsdale is responsible for the book while Harry Graham and Jean Gilbert are credited with lyric and music, respectively. The show had an unusual run in London and reaches Chicago after twenty weeks on Broadway. A large and capable company is employed with chief honors going to Jack Sheehan, a young comedian who is an outstanding hit. The music is excellent and the entire

evening's entertainment as clean as the proverbial hound's tooth.

At the 4-Cohens theater, Miss Helen Hayes is making the hit of her life in Barrie's, "What Every Woman Knows." This, probably the best play Barrie ever wrote, was used some twenty years ago, and has survived and is revived because of sheer merit. In the part of Maggie Wylie, who tries to hold her husband, Miss Hayes gives a remarkable performance. One dreams, and hopes and understands with Maggie as she struggles along in her all-powerful love. Miss Hayes is not acting, she is living Maggie every moment of the time. A very fine supporting cast has been provided, Kenneth MacKenna being particularly effective as the husband and Lumsden Hare continuing his previous success as Mr. Venables.
