Llewellyn Jones, author and literary critic of the Chicago Evening Post, was the speaker Wednesday atternoon at Harris hall, Northwestern university campus, delivering the contemporary thought course lecture directed by Prof. Baker Brownell.

Zona Gale, prominent author, dramatist and educator, who was scheduled to speak next Wednesday, will not come until April 20. She will at that time discuss "The New Literature."

The lectures in May will be given in sequence by Shailer Mathews, Prof. Delton T. Howard, Prof. Richard T. Ely and Clarence Darrow, and the final lecture will be delivered June 1 by Prof. Brownell.


