

YES SIR, WAU BUN HAS ITS POLITICS

Newest North Shore Community in Midst of Torrid Election Campaign Just Now

The older villages along the north shore have nothing on the newest village in the township, Wau Bun, in the way of staging a red hot political fight at the annual village election.

And, for Wau Bun, it will in reality be the first annual event of that nature, too, but, nevertheless, the contest next Tuesday promises to be as spirited as any of the several hotly contested elections which have been characterizing the selection of candidates in various north shore villages this spring.

Wau Bun, at the time of its incorporation and organization as a village last summer, elected a president and six village trustees who were to serve only until this spring, at which time there was to be held the first annual election when a president would be chosen for a two year term, and six trustees, who would cast lots to determine which three were to serve one year, each, and which three were to constitute the "hold-overs" for the two year term.

Started Last Autumn

Last fall, at the election for the purpose of choosing officials to serve until this spring, the honors went to John Happ, as president, with John Seul, Ben Schildgen, Alex Levernier, George Selzer, Peter Selzer, W. R. Boetsch, and Leo Retzinger as trustees.

Many things have been taking place out at Wau Bun the past few months, especially since the ertswile flag station out on the High Line of the North Western suddenly blossomed into an incorporated village on the new Skokie Valley Electric line; where farm acreage has suddenly been transformed into scores of fine building sites overlooking the beautiful Skokie valley to the east, and where large business interests are already expending thousands of dollars in fuel and other supply yards. Thus, wide and varving differences of opinion have arisen among members of the official family as to how the details of the future course of the growing Wau Bun should be conducted.

Therefore, President Happ has headed the Citizen's party ticket for reelection, and has associated with him as candidates for trustees, John Seul, Henry Wahls, Fred Haut and John Efflandt. Seul, like Happ, is a member of the present board, but Wahls, Haut and Efflandt are new candidates.

Enter, the People's Party

Opposing the Citizen's ticket is the People's ticket, headed by Ben Schildgen, the new candidate for president, and with him, as candidates for trustees, Alex Levernier, George Selzer, Peter Selzer, W. R. Boetsch, Louis Britzman and Leo Retzinger. Both Schildgen and Britzman are new nominees, while Levernier, George and Peter Selzer, Boetsch, and Retzinger are now members of the board.

Six trustees are to be elected, which number has been nominated by the People's ticket, but the Citizen's ticket has entered only four candidates for trustee posts. In the event the entire Citizen's ticket should be elected, there will also be chosen two of the trustees on the other ticket. But there are few predictions being made as to the outcome of this first annual election, except that all are agreed there will be a one hundred percent vote polled.

Enlarge Facilities of Hubbard Woods Concerns

The Cooper-Manierre Trust company is building at 895-899 Linden avenue, Hubbard Woods, a one-story brick garage and store room with entrance from Tower road east of the Standard Oil company station.

This building will be completed, it is expected, on or about May 1, when the store section will be utilized by A. W. Zengler and company, dyers and cleaners, and by William Edwards and Son, in addition to the space they now occupy at the same number.

term of ten years to Edward R. Bell, who will, about May 1, open a general repair garage to service all makes of cars. Mr. Bell has been in the automobile repair business in Winnetka for the past fifteen years, and until recently was located at 909 Linden avenue, Hubbard Woods.

J. D. Austin and company, 899 Linden avenue, Hubbard Woods, were brokers for all parties in negotiating this lease.

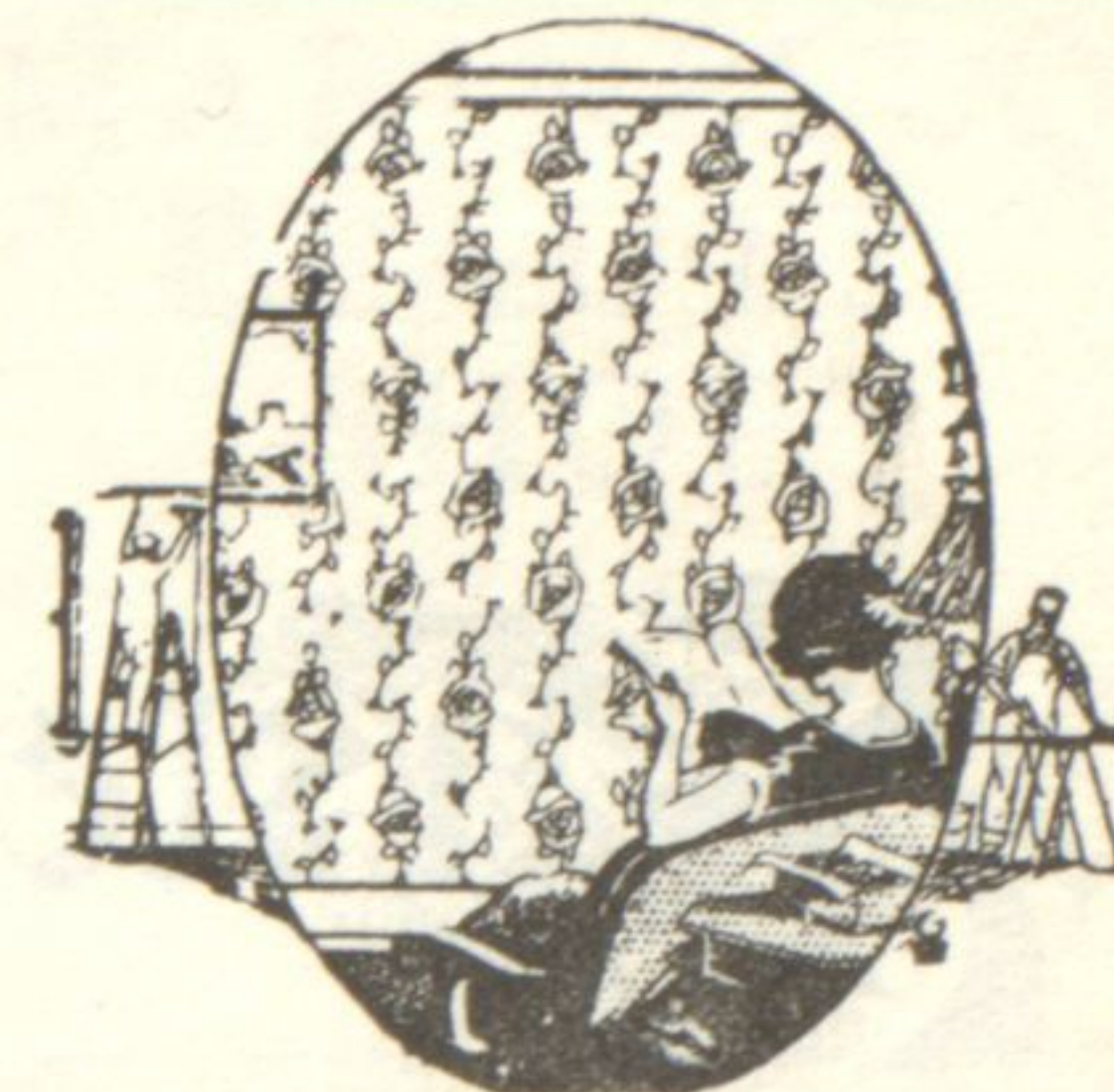
