## Two Parties Wage Election Battle Out Glenview Way

The Citizens' party and the Progressive party each have tickets in the field at Glenview where the village election will be held next Tuesday, for the election of a president and four trustees.

Lester W. Coons, who recently resigned from the board as a trustee, is the candidate for president on the Citizens' party ticket, on which the candidates for trustees are, Henry F. Miller, Richard Gould, Ben Kirk and John Gateje.

The progressive ticket is headed by H. M. McCullen, candidate for re-election to that office. The four candidates for trustees on this ticket are Carl A. Ladendorf, Oscar L. Scalbom, Louis Voelk and Ernest Schultz.

In addition to the selection of five village officials, Glenview citizens will vote on the proposition to annex one Rockford college Monday after a ten of the largest additions to the village that has been proposed. This is the Harlem Park sub-division, owned by Axel Lonnquist of Wilmette. The property fronts for approximately three quarters of a mile on Waukegan road, and is being developed by Mr. Lonnquist and the entire Lonnquist company.
