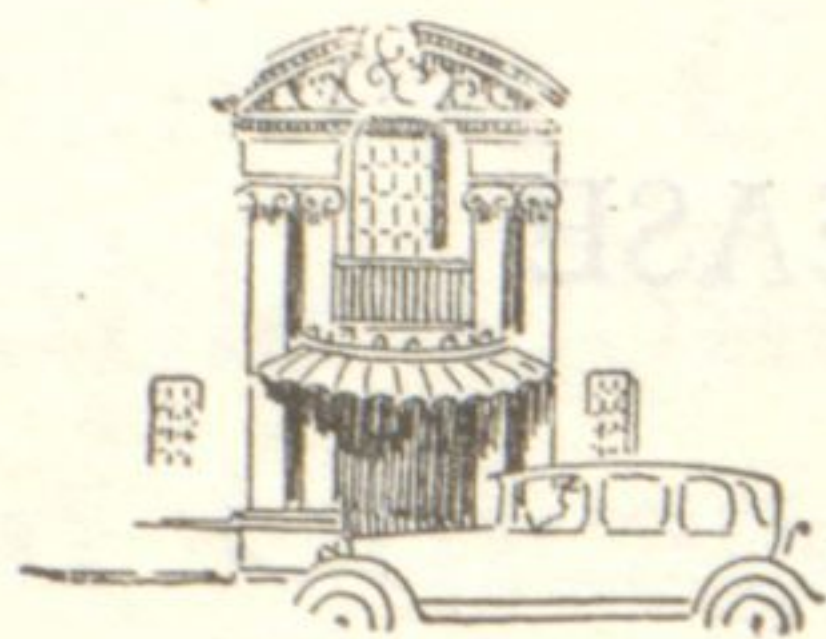

Northwestern Ranks Well
in 1926 Library Catalog

The American Library association catalog for 1926 is an annotated, basic list of 10,000 books; a selective publication which covers the entire range of literature on all subjects of all time. In compiling this catalog thousands of volumes were consulted. These 10,000 titles form a working library representing the best thought of about 500 competent judges in their various departments.

In this scholarly catalog, Northwestern university is represented by sixty-five authors who are either alumni, or past or present members of the faculty. They compose 1/153 of the total number of names.

Since many of these authors are represented by more than one title apiece, there are 109 titles in all, or 1/91 of the total number.

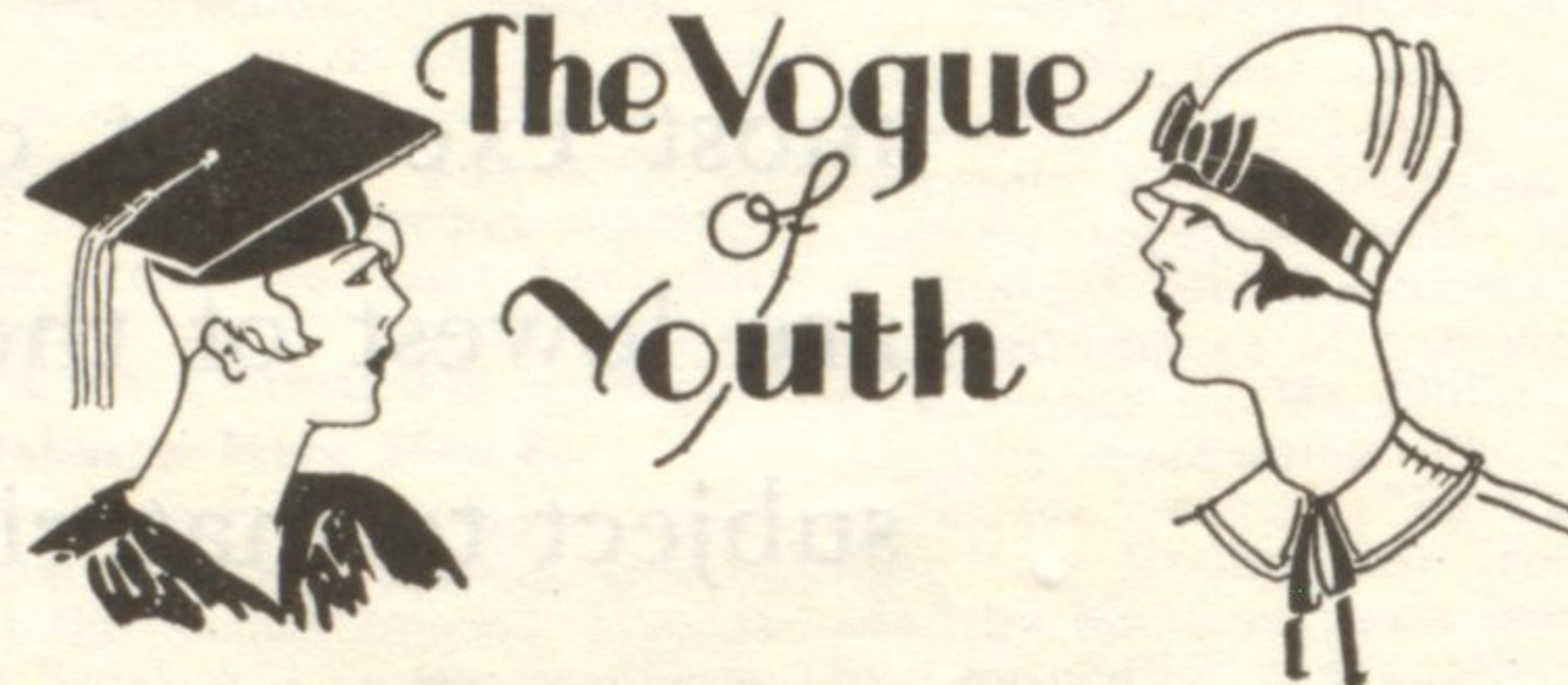

Playwrights Here

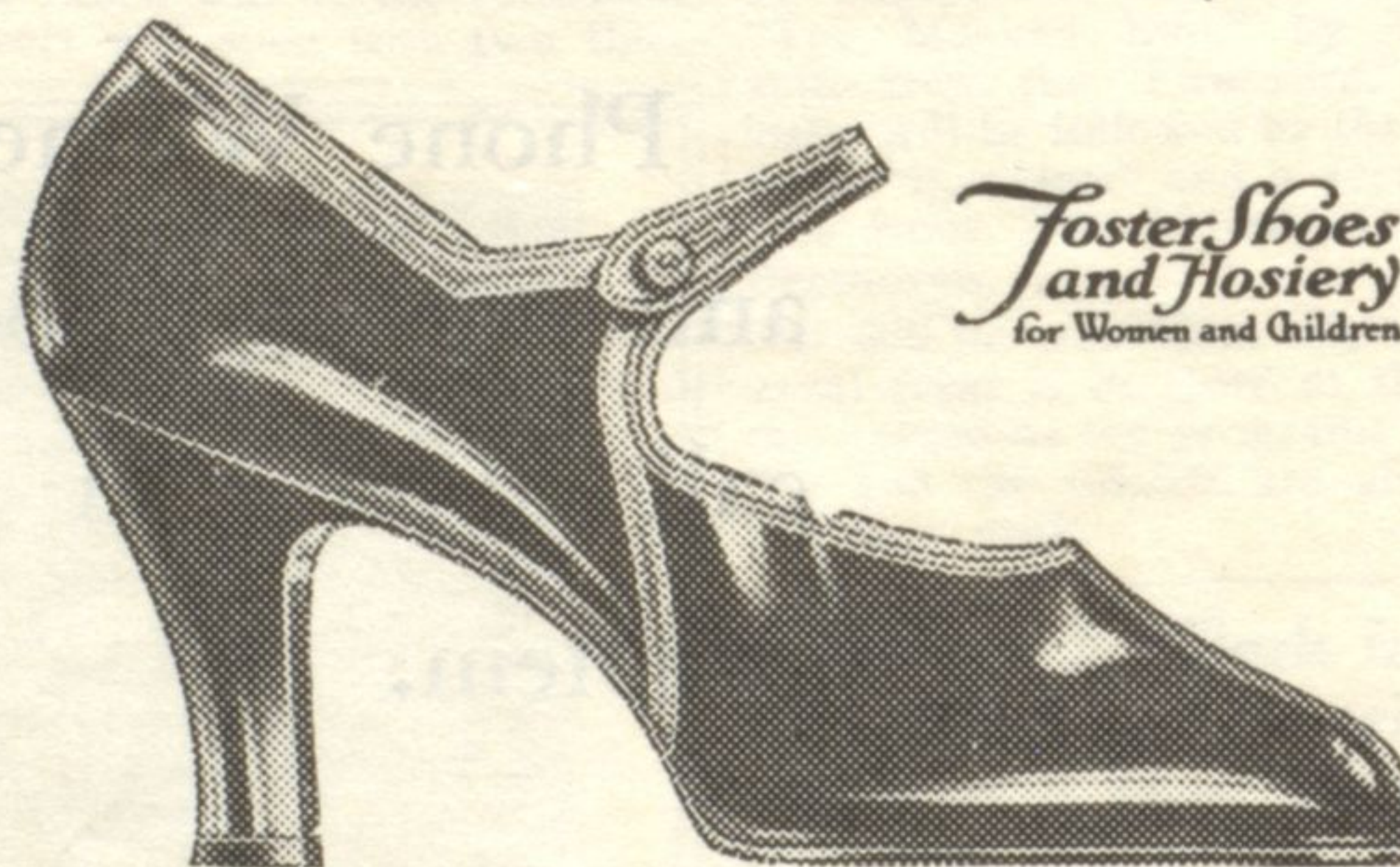
North shore society folk whose interest in dramatic productions extends beyond acting and producing, into the playwriting field, will welcome the announcement of a play-writing contest to be held under the auspices of the Drama League of America.

Laird Bell of 1352 Tower road, Winnetka, president of the North Shore Theater guild, will choose the judges for this nation-wide competition for the best "little-theater experimental one-act play, unusual in conception and treatment." A \$250 prize is offered, together with a percentage of the proceeds and a guarantee of production.

Many north shore residents are active in the guild. Mrs. Laird Bell, who took part in the recent production of Milne's three-act comedy, "Ariadne," is one of the founders of the organization; Alexander Dean is its stage director; Rosamond Coffin, Lawrence Norem and George Bartlett are other north shore residents who are prominent in guild work.
