### Christian Science Churches

"Unreality" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, Sunday, April 3.

The Golden Text was from Proverbs 22:12, "The eyes of the Lord preserve knowledge, and he overthroweth the words of the transgressor."

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places" (Eph. 6:10-12).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "Despite the hallowing influence of Truth in the destruction of error, must error still be immortal? Truth spares all that is true. If evil is real, Truth must make it so; but error, not Truth, is the author of the unreal, and the unreal vanishes, while all that is real is eternal" (p. 474).
