concerned in this little country? Mr. Binder answered this question with the following reasons: because of the agitation for the construction of a second interoceanic canal across Nicaragua for which the United States has already acquired rights; and because of a fear the state department has of the spread and rise of bolshevism within the tiny country. Even though there seems to be no true pro-American feeling either in the leaders or in the ignorant and poor classes, and even though rumors of messages from the seat of communism in Russia sent to Nicaragua sound disastrous, Mr. Binder cannot harbor the same fear the State department has.

Whether or not the United States should withdraw her marines from stormy little Nicaragua, withdraw the supervision of finances, collection of customs and leave the little state alone is a moot question, Mr. Binder states. He says that the imperialistic attitude of our government will not allow us to neglect our interests as to a second canal, and yet the marines do not seem to be settling the question.

Education is restricted to a certain few in Nicaragua and aside from the splendid work the Rockefeller foundation is doing in checking hookworm and other tropical diseases, schools and doctors are unknown.

In addition to Mr. Binder's speech the day's program included an interesting group of readings given by Mrs.

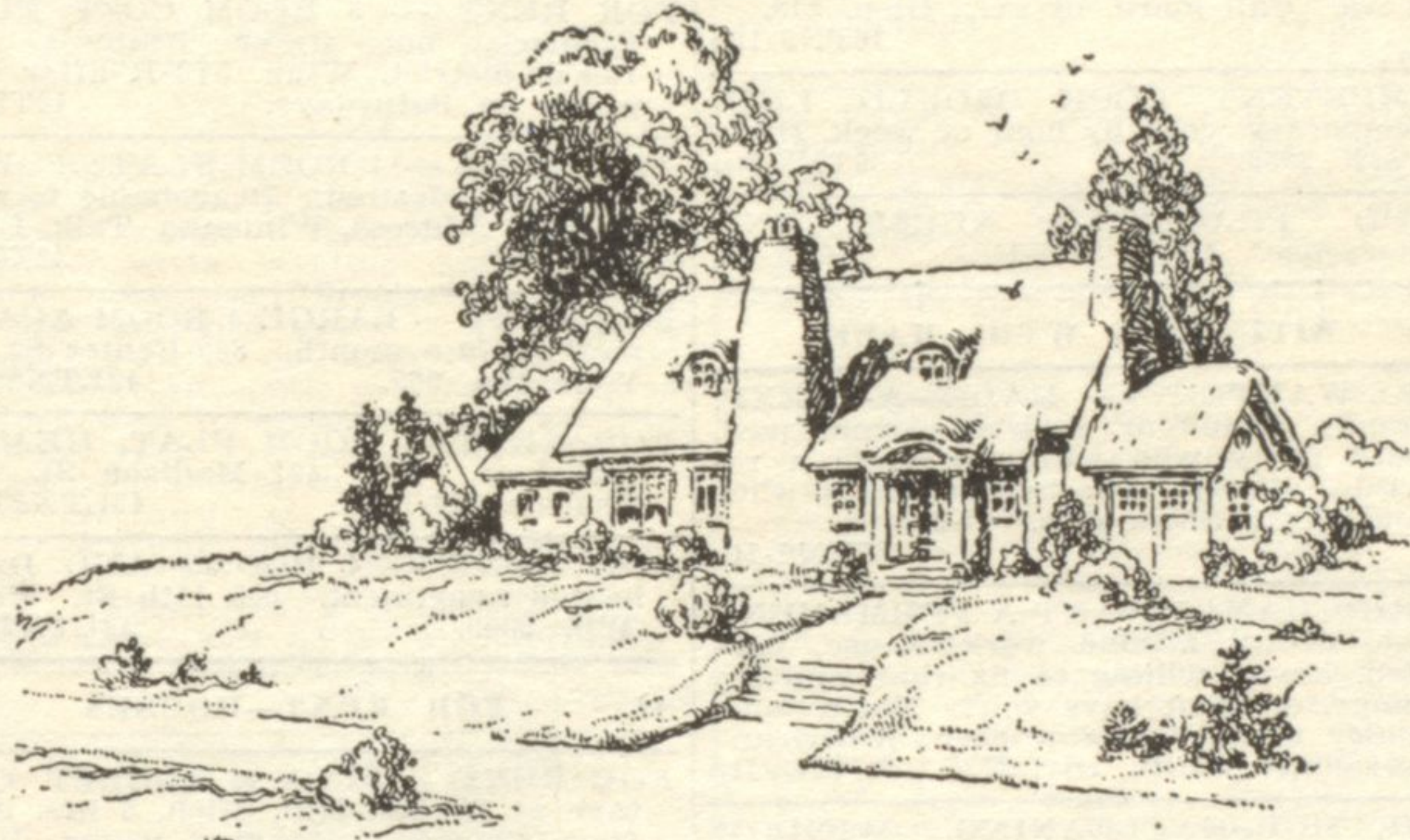

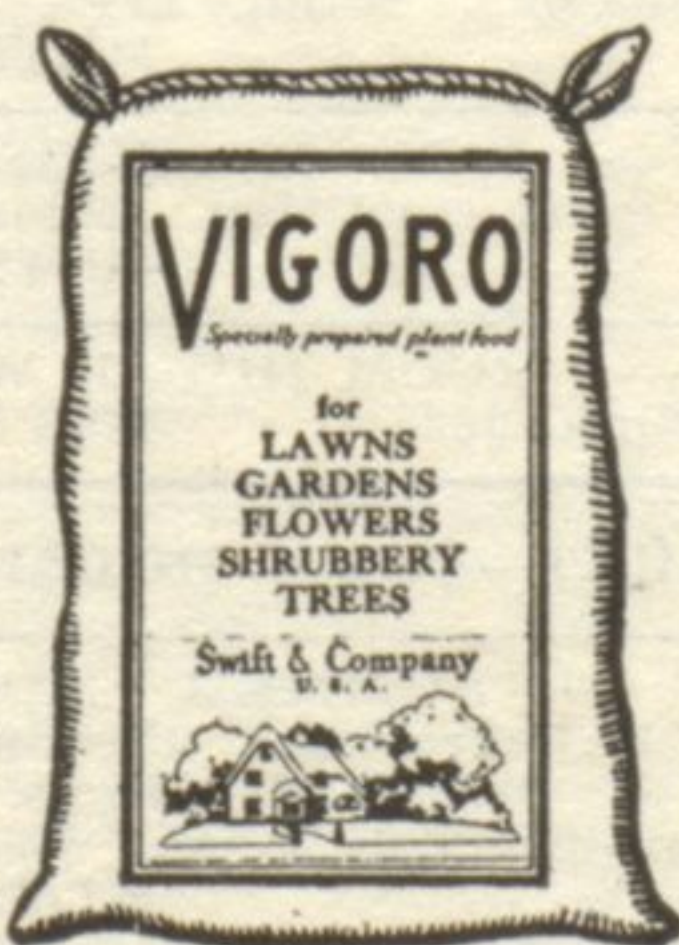
