Eminent Medical Authority Speaks to N. U. Students

Tuberculosis is so treacherous that, one may harbor the deadly bacilli for almost a life-time, and show no symptom of the malady. And then—there may be a shock, a sudden cold at a bad time of the year or some accident or mishap, and the germs which have lurked latently in the system are spread about the body, and active or clinical tuberculosis results. Northwestern University Medical students and faculty were given an interesting talk on these features of this disease Monday afternoon by Dr. Allen K. Krause, of Johns Hopkins University, one of the most distinguished research scholars in the realm of tuberculosis study in America. The speaker is in Chicago as the guest of the Chicago Tuberculosis Institute and will make various addresses on this topic during the next few days. At yesterday's meeting at Northwestern he was heard not only by a large number of medical students but by practicing physicians and by visitors, both men and women who are identified with the work of the Chicago institute.

Throughout his discussion, the Johns Hopkins professor stressed the importance of the individual type of the disease, saying that hard and fast rules upon tuberculosis covering all cases are almost impossible. Each individual must be studied and his type of the malady must be treated as the symptoms seem to demand.

That there are many cases of latent tuberculosis, the speaker did not seem to doubt. Persons who have this type of the malady may not cough nor expectorate, he said, but they still may have the disease. They may go along for months or years or possibly a lifetime and not develop active tuberculosis. Then the shock comes and like a galloping horse the bacilli get into action and romp over the entire system. Dr. Krause, for the benefit of the medical students, went into these details explicitly and was most heartily applauded by the medical youngsters as well as by their seniors in service. The visitor was presented by Dean Irving S. Cutter, head of Northwestern University Medical School. The meeting took place in the Archibald Church Library in the Montgomery Ward Memorial, McKinlock campus.
