Four thousand pine and spruce trees had been secured previously from the State Department of Agriculture. The Camp Fire Girls, with the aid of adults who dug the holes, planted four thousand trees, "Litahni Forest." And what is more, they planted the forest in one day! None of the girls will ever forget this thrilling red-letter day. The remainder of the time was spent identifying trees and birds, tracking over the eighty acres, thereby earning Camp Fire nature honors, and in play. Everybody had a glorious outing and helped in the country's big re-forestation program.

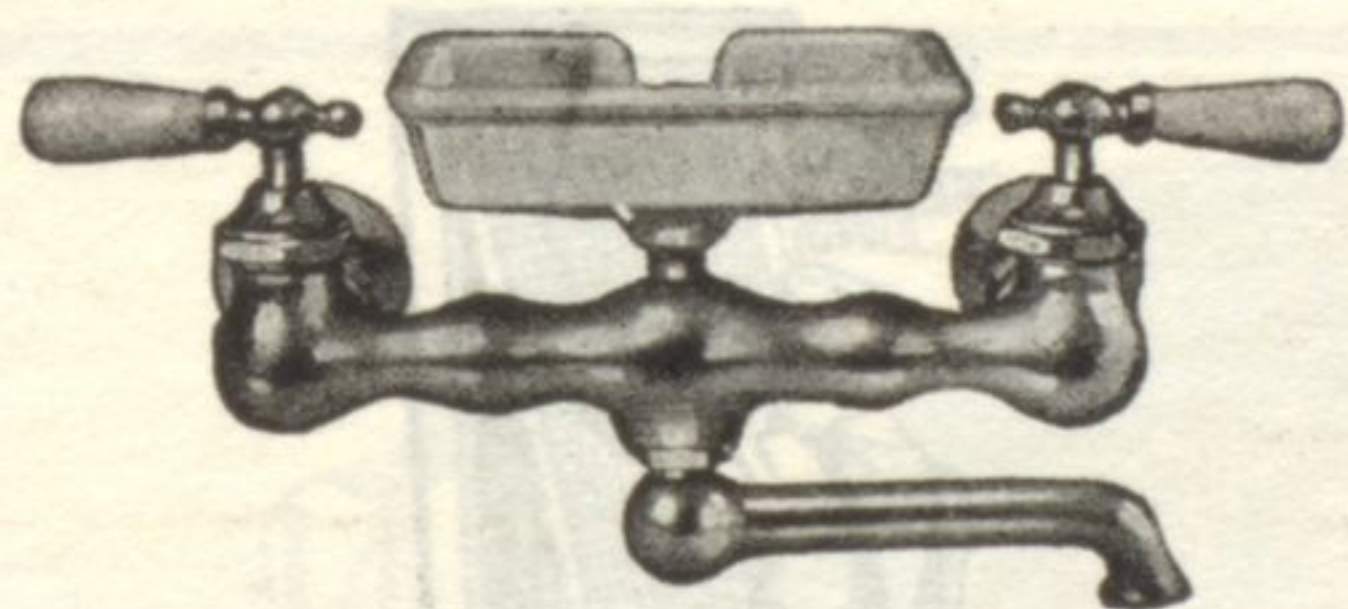
