Red Cross Institute to Train in Life Saving

To aid in reducing the number of deaths from drowning and other accidents, the Chicago Chapter of the Red Cross will again conduct its first aid and life saving institute at Lake Lawn, Lake Delavan, Wis., June 16-26.

Normal courses for both men and women in life saving, boating, waterfront protection, and coaching will again be offered. Life guards, Boy and Girl Scout leaders, councillors for summer camps, playground and recreation workers from all parts of the

middle west will learn from championship swimmers and authorities on waterfront protection all the latest developments in diving, swimming, boating, and life saving organization.

While instruction in water safety is the primary aim, a full standard and an advanced course in first aid will be given by qualified physicians attached to the Red Cross staff. Information can be secured from the American Red Cross, 616 S. Michigan avenue, Chicago.
