Berton Lawrence Named Organist at New Cinema

Wtih the appointment of Berton Lawrence to preside at the console of the \$25,000 Kimball symphony organ, the adequacy of the Teatro del Lago's musical accompaniments seems assured.

A graduate of Northwestern university, where he received his B. A. degree, Mr. Lawrence has achieved considerable prominence in western musical circles and, although he has been performing in theaters but a short time, he is said to be one of the highest salaried cinema organists in this section. He has been featured in some of Chicago's largest picture houses.

Lawrence, it is said, plays the classical and popular music with equal facility. He has made a long and intensive study of synchronizing music with photoplays and has become particularly adept in this respect. He spends hours scoring each picture and as a result his efforts greatly enhance the entertainment value of the photoplays he accompanies.

"Every picture," says Mr. Lawrence, "requires a distinct musical interpretation of its own. Every picture has its own 'atmosphere' and this I strive to emphasize in my accompaniments in order to make the effect as authentic as possible. That is why study each picture individually. It is my aim to make music not an incident to a picture, but a complement to it, an integral part of the motif portrayed on the screen."

The del Lago's huge organ will give Mr. Lawrence ample opportunity to demonstrate his virtuosity as it is one of the best equipped and most complete instruments of its kind ever constructed for use in a theater.


Trains of Raw Material Needed for New Theater


