Funeral of H. E. Odhner Will Be This Afternoon

The funeral of H. E. Odhner, of 1150 Tower road, Winnetka, who was killed by a North Western passenger train at the Woodland avenue crossing in Glencoe, Wednesday morning, will be conducted from the Parish House of Christ church, on Oak street, this afternoon at 2 o'clock. Burial will be at Memorial Park cemetery.

Mr. Odhner was 46 years of age. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Annie Odhner and one daughter, Miss Alice. A brother, John and a sister, Mrs. Carl Anderson, also reside in Winnetka, and two brothers and two sisters and his father, reside in Sweden. He had been a resident here for 15 years. Mr. Odhner was a member of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows.

The coroner's inquest into the death of Mr. Odhner was held at Schaefer Brothers' undertaking establishment, 1573 Maple avenue, Evanston, Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The jury, in its finding, recommended that the railroad company place gates and a gateman at the Woodland avenue crossing.

Two Cars Crash at Corner of Elm and Maple Avenues

Two automobiles, one driven by Mrs. E. W. Rosenheim, of 1046 Vine street and the other by Mrs. S. O. Aspenwall, of 1195 Tower road, crashed at Elm street and Maple avenue Wednesday afternoon, the impact diverting both cars into the parkway. Mrs. Rosenheim was driving east on Elm street and hit the other car which was going south on Maple. Neither of the drivers was injured. Sergeant Harry Enault and Motorcycle Officer E. Schubert reported the accident.

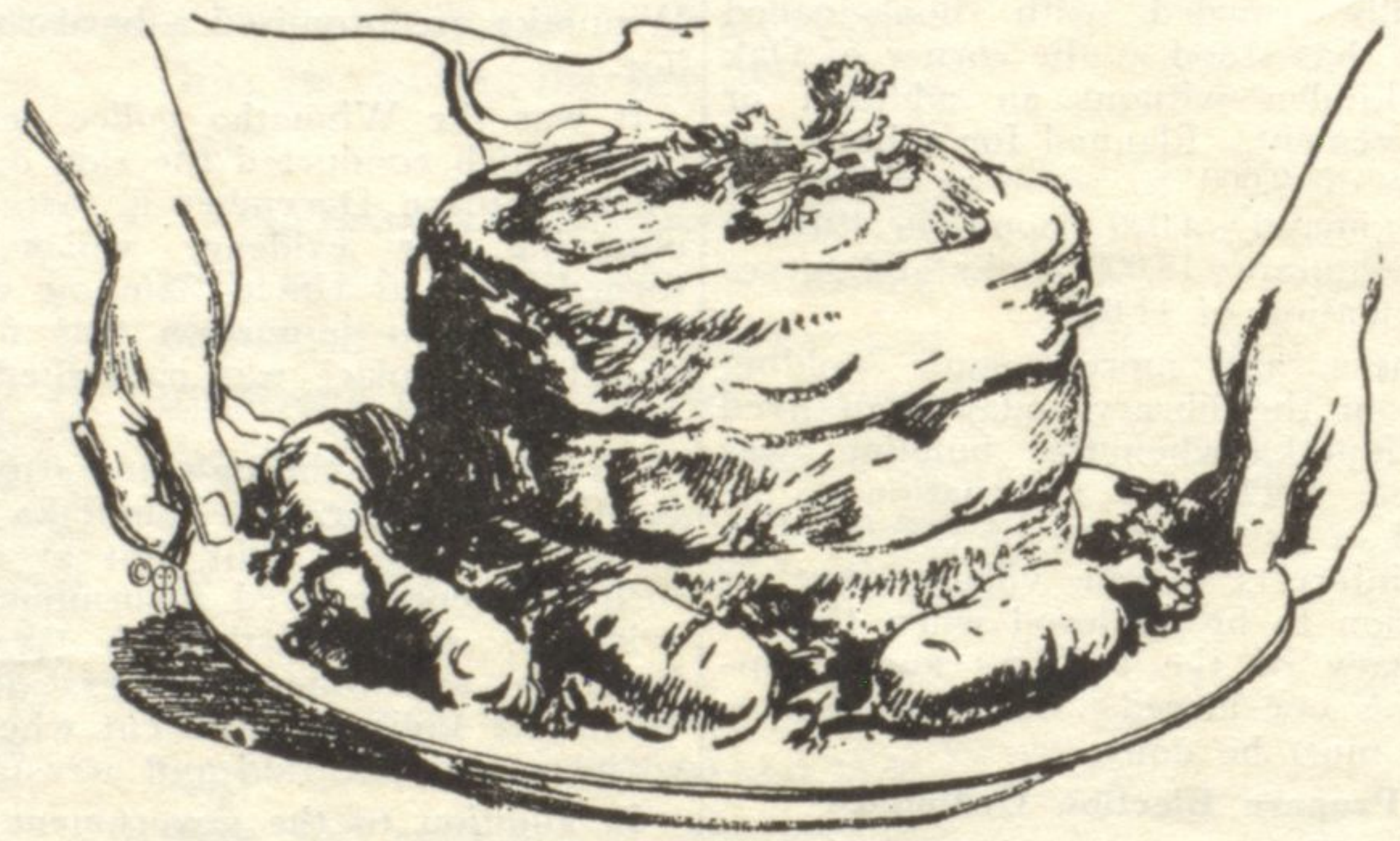
