Noted Soloist Is Added to Number to Appear in Festival

Miss Anna Case, noted concert soprano, has been added to the soloists who are to appear at the concerts of the North Shore Festival, May 23 to 28. Miss Case has never been heard in Evanston. She will be heard at the Saturday evening concert, according to present plans, together with Lawrence Tibbett, the popular baritone. She may also be heard on one of the other programs. Miss Case will replace Mary Lewis, whose engagement has been cancelled.

Lawrence Tibbett, who will also appear on the evening program, May 28, is a favorite with Festival audiences. He is a significant figure in the musical world as he is American born, American trained and has achieved his successes in this country without the foreign appearances supposed by many to be necessary for success in the United States.

Mr. Tibbett was born in Bakersfield, Cal., and is twenty-eight years old. He went through high school in Los Angeles and then decided to turn his attention to the stage, his first training being received with an organization playing Shakespeare. Later he joined the Civic Repertory company. After receiving this training in the drama, which included an appearance as Iago in "Othello," he turned his attention to opera. He sang the part of Amonasro in Verdi's "Aida," which was given in the Hollywood bowl.

After having received this training Mr. Tibbett decided to devote himself to grand opera and went to New York in 1922, taking his wife and twin boys with him. In order to do this he disposed of everything he had and borrowed on his life insurance. Five months after he reached New York he was engaged by the Metropolitan company, with which organization he won a sensational success.

Miss Alice Carey, daughter of the W. J. Careys of 883 Oak street, has returned to her studies at De Paul university after an appendicitis operation.





