

### Many Attend Opening of Teatro del Lago in "No Man's Land"

Teatro del Lago which brings to No Man's Land near Wilmette a distinct touch of Spanish architecture opened its doors for the first time last Saturday night. A large crowd attended the premier showing and went away satisfied that the new cinema palace is all that its owners claim for it.

The approach to the theater from Sheridan road is along a short thoroughfare lined with store buildings constructed in true Spanish style. Finished in sand surface white plaster, inset with Spanish tile panels and surmounted with colorful copings, cornices and tile roofs, the shops and theater create an atmosphere decidedly Spanish.

Elaborate decoration has been avoided on the interior. The large foyer with its vaulted ceiling and concealed lighting is beautifully furnished with chairs, lounges, tables and lamps. The auditorium contains 1,400 seats and has the same Spanish effect as the exterior.

The Kimball Symphony organ is one of the decided attractions in the new theater and the capable manner in which it is played by Berton Lawrence proved highly pleasing to the opening night crowds.

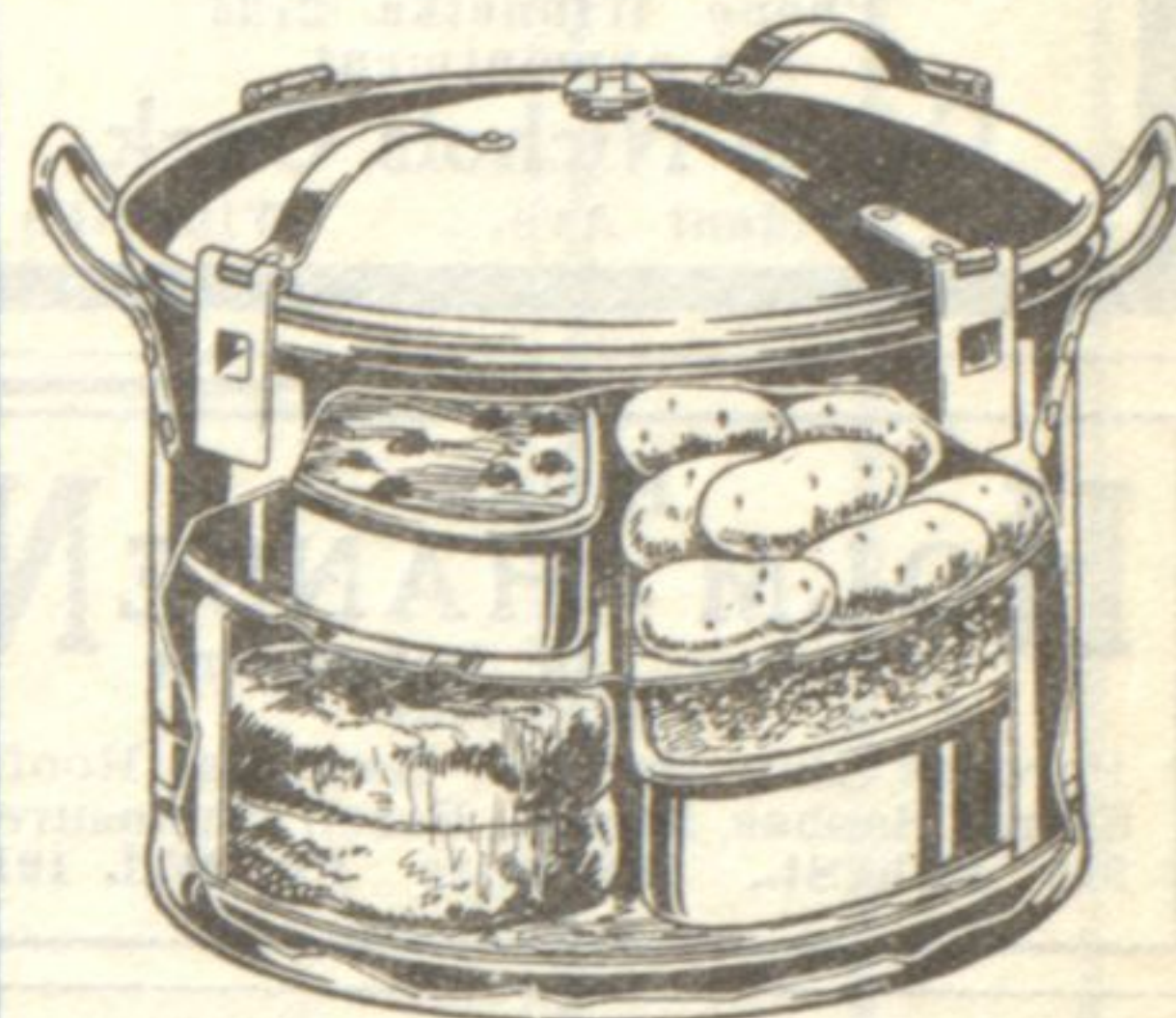
