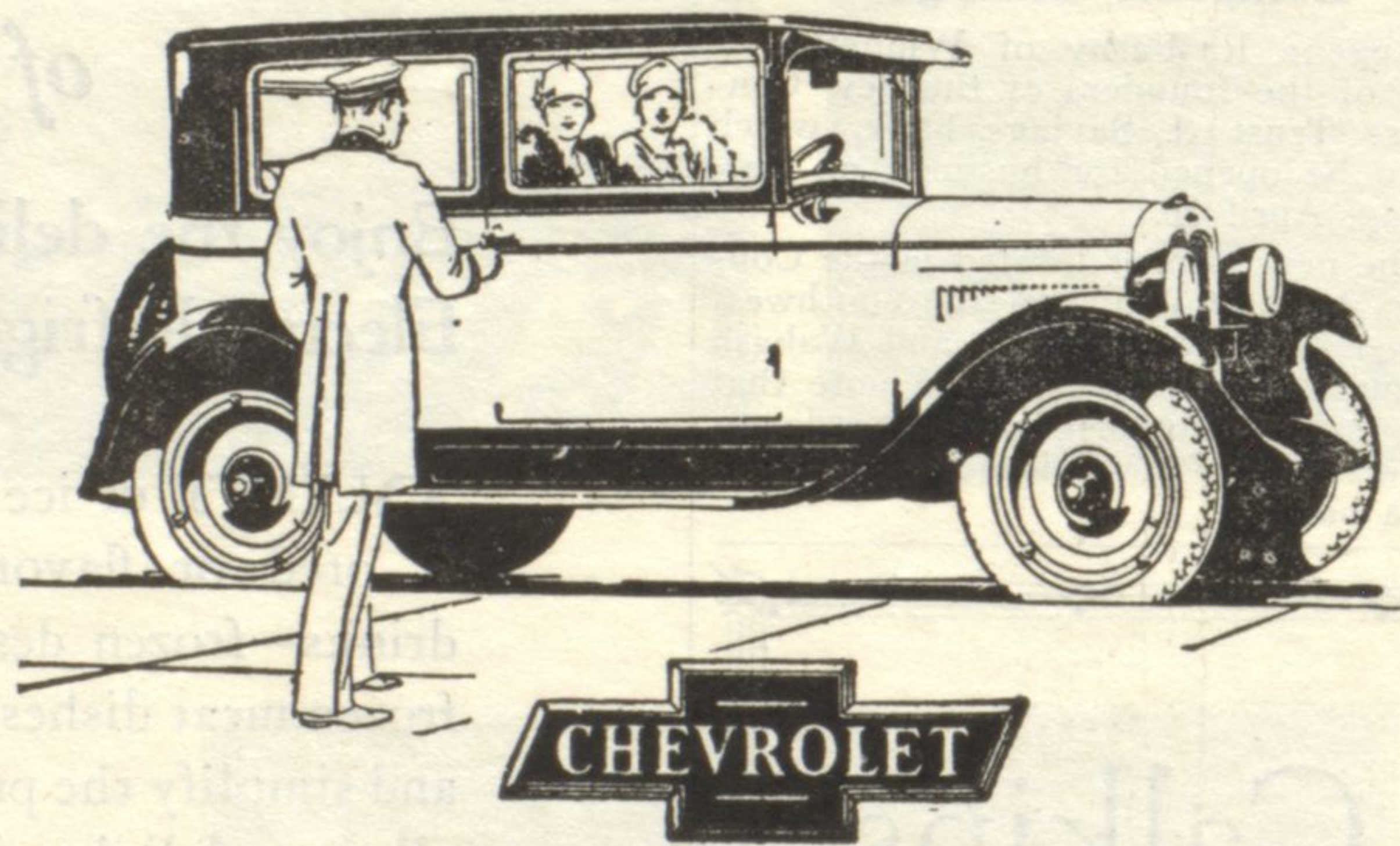
A large crowd was at hand for the opening day performance, and the boys thank the loyal rooters for coming out in such inclement weather.
