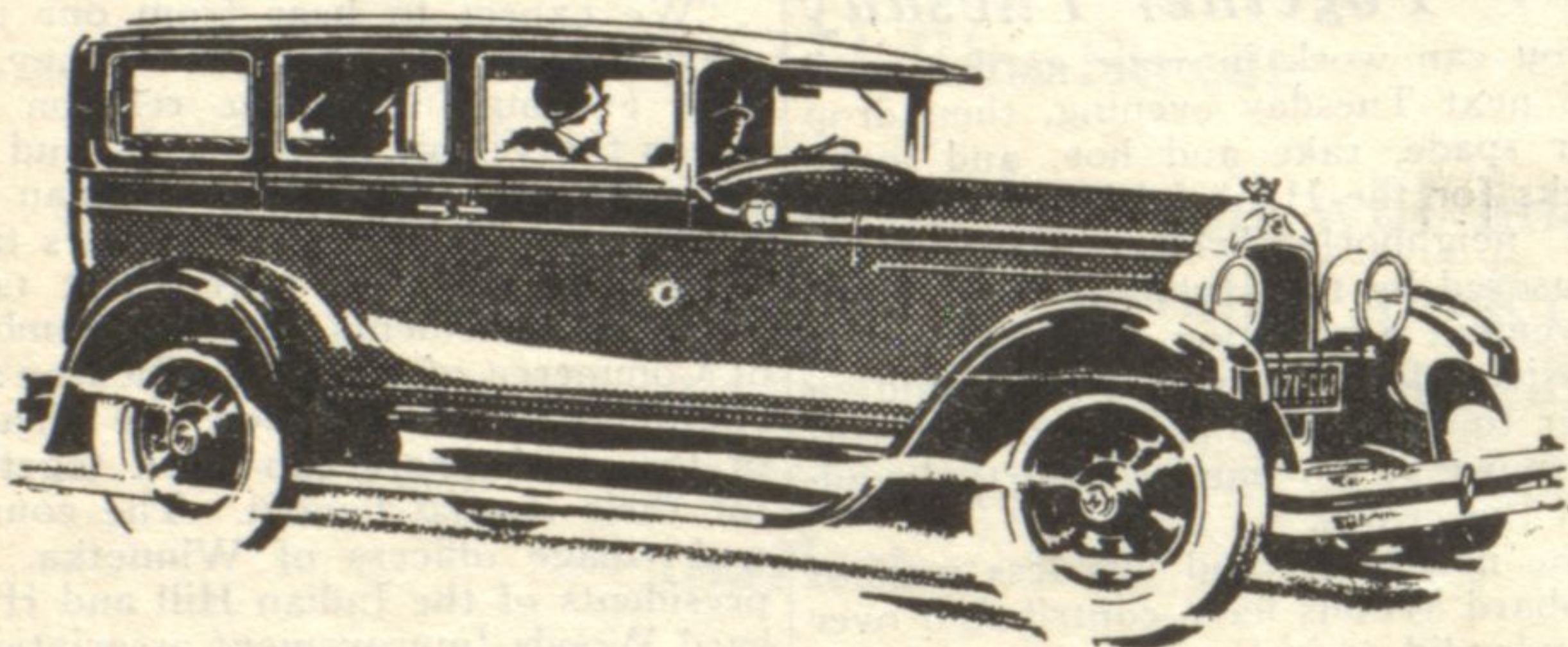

EDITS BOOK ON CAMPS

"Out of Doors With Youth" Subject of Volume Written by Dr. J. W. F. Davies on Camping Experience

"Out of Doors with Youth," by Dr. J. W. F. Davies, director of Community House and Minister of Education in the Congregational church, of Winnetka, is the title of a 172 page book which came off the press last week and which is already meeting with a demand which this latest work for leaders of Boys' and Girls' camps justly deserves.

The book was brought out last week during the convention of the Religious Education Association at the Congress hotel, Chicago, of which Dr. Davies is an officer and director. Thirty-two states and six foreign countries, including China, Japan and Western Australia, were represented at this convention. Because of the author's widely recognized authority on this important subject, his book was at once in demand, and many of the first edition copies were purchased by the delegates.

The book is published by The Uni-

versity of Chicago Press. It is dedicated "To Indian Hill Campers, who have developed the art of living together."

Dr. Davies has made in "Out of Doors with Youth," a study of the possibilities of the summer camp of religion. He sees in these camps a wonderful opportunity for character building.

Leaders and educators of young people have come to realize the value of these camps. Camping is educational. Churches, schools and other institutions that have to do with youth have found them of great benefit to boys and girls and to the community.

Dr. Davies' study will be useful to leaders of summer camps. His book is not a philosophy of camping; it is a simple statement born of twenty years of practical experience in camping, during which the author found the conduct of camps to be one of the finest pieces of constructive work in character building.

Illustrations throughout the book are from camp scenes at Lake Hamlin, Ludington, Mich., where Chief Davies for many years has conducted camps, one for the boys and one for the girls of Winnetka, each camp being for a period of eighteen days.

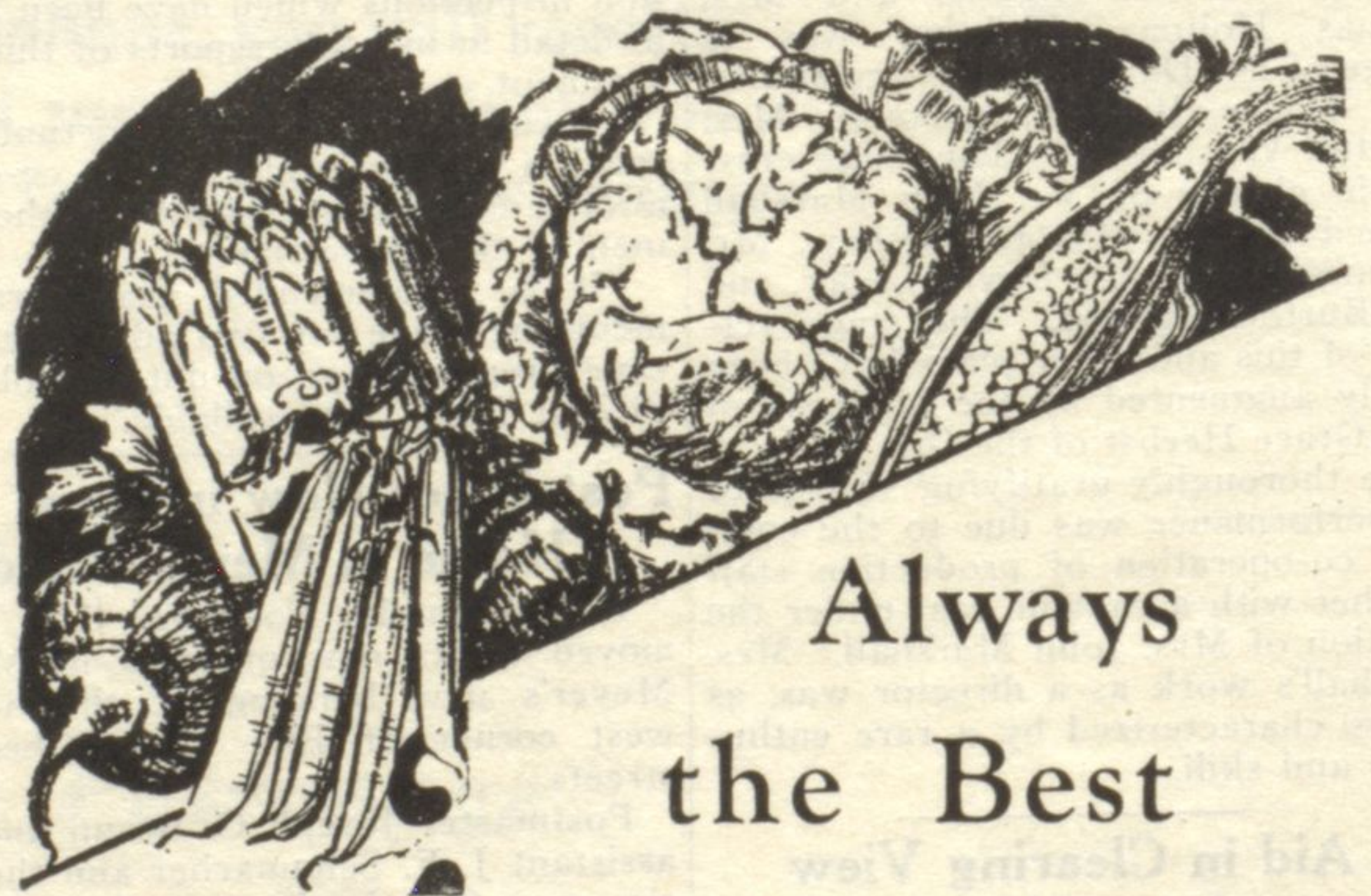
