

New Dodge Cars Have Sturdier Transmission

Outstanding among the changes recently announced in Dodge Brothers entire line of passenger cars is the adoption of a sturdier, more compact transmission with the gears arranged for standard shift. The new gearset, according to the announcement from the factory received by C. M. McDonald, north shore dealer, entered production at the same time as the new Dodge Brothers motor.

"The aim of the designer," says Mr. McDonald, "was to provide a gearset so sturdy that although transmitting the increased power developed by the new engine it would sustain the good reputation earned by the former transmission for long life and freedom from wear.

"The gears are heavier and stronger than those of the former transmission and are made of chrome vanadium steel heat treated in electrical furnaces.

"Both of the shafts which support the gears have been made stronger and stiffer than those in the former transmission and are also of chrome vanadium steel. The diameter of the countershaft has been increased and the length shortened."
