Henry H. Brigham of Glencoe, president of the North American Car Corporation, is returning from a business trip to London, on the Berengaria, having sailed from Cherbourg, France on May 7.

While there he completed arrangements for financing the export sales of petroleum products from independent refiners by the organization of two companies to act as media—one an English company, the other an American company.

He has also further developed the contact with Burt, Boulton & Haywood, Ltd., an old established English import and export company, which has made considerable success in the placing of cargoes made up from independent refiners handled through the North American Car Corporation's export terminals at New Orleans. A director of the English company, the Earl of Dunmore, V. C., D. S. O., of London, visited Chicago in February, at which time negotiations were initiated.
