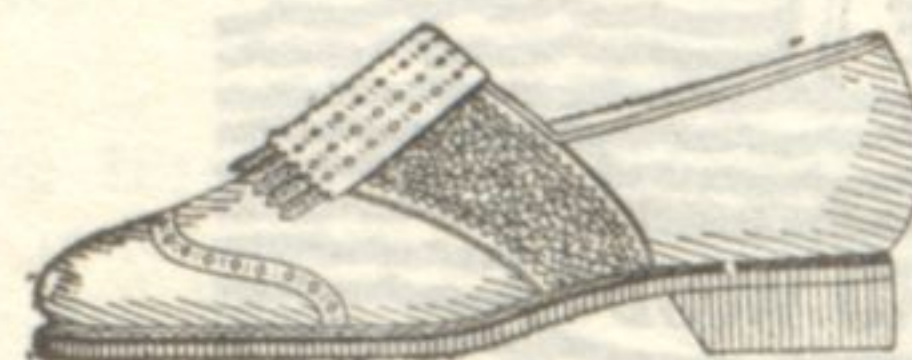

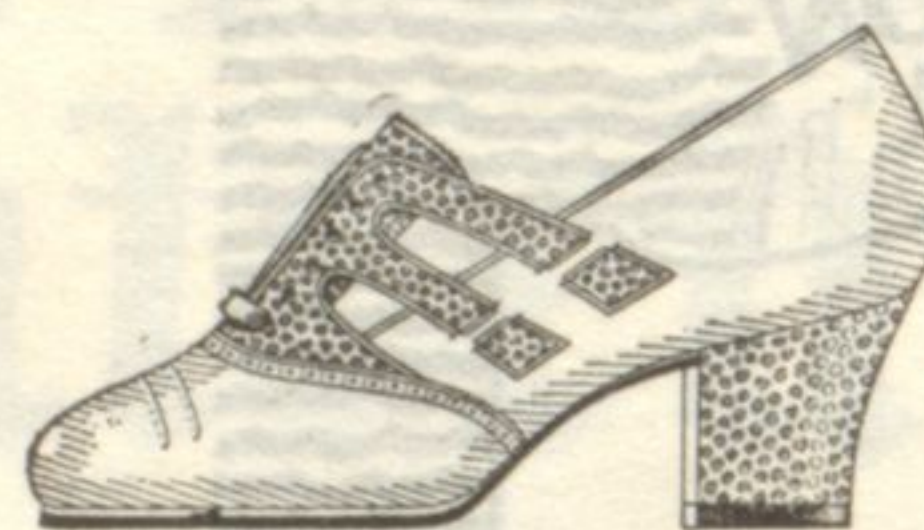

## BIG CHORUS IS READY

Dean Lutkin's Organization of 570 Voices Puts in Last Rehearsals; to Sing Famed "Sea Symphony"

The North Shore Music festival chorus of 570 voices is enthusiastically and diligently rehearsing for its part in the program of Music Festival week beginning Monday. The "Sea Symphony" by Vaughan Williams, on which the chorus is spending considerable preparation, will probably be the most popular number on its program for this year, according to Dean P. C. Lutkin, who is directing the choral work. This symphony was written in 1910 and has been popular in England, being considered one of the greatest choral works of recent years. This will be its first performance here.

About ten percent of the members of this year's chorus have sung with the group each year since its first appearance nineteen years ago. Dean Lutkin has been the director ever since its beginning.

A feature of the chorus is its democratic nature, for it consists of people from all ranks of society bound together by a mutual love of music. There are doctors, lawyers, businessmen, and business as well as society women and housewives. The only requisites are a fair voice and some experience in choral singing.
