## NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a SPECIAL ELECTION is to be held in the VILLAGE OF WINNETKA, on Saturday, June 11th, 1927, for the purpose of voting upon a certain ordinance submitted for the approval of the voters of said Village, as follows:

## AN ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO THE AMOUNT OF SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000.00) FOR CONSTRUCTING AN ADDITION AND MAKING ALTERATIONS TO THE FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY OF THE VILLAGE OF WIN-NETKA AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF.

THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF WINNETKA DOES ORDAIN: SECTION 1. That for the purpose of providing funds for the cost of constructing an addition and making alterations to the Village Library of said Village of Winnetka, there are hereby authorized to be issued seventy-five (75) Village of Winnetka Library Addition Bonds of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) each, each Read and ordered engrossed: March 29, 1927. to be dated July 1, 1927, and each bearing interest evidenced by coupons at the rate of four and one-quarter per cent (41/4%) per annum, payable January 1, 1928, and semi-annually thereafter on January first and July first of each year; three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) of the issue of said bonds to become due on the first day of July in each of the years 1928 to 1939 inclusive; four thousand dollars (\$4,000.00) in the amount of said bonds to become due on the first day of July in the year 1940; and five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) in the amount of said bonds to become due on the first day of July in each of the years 1941 to 1947 inclusive.

SECTION 2. The bonds hereby authorized shall be in substantially the follow-

Both North, Range 13 East, in the Village of Winnetka, Cook County, Illinois. principal and interest of this bond are hereby made payable in gold coin of the United States of the present standard of weight and fineness at the office of the Village Treasurer in the Village of Winnetka, Illinois.

This bond is one of a series of like tenor, except maturities, providing for the cost of constructing an addition to and making alterations in the Village Library in said Village of Winnetka, and the same is issued under authority of Chapter 81 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Illinois and of an ordinance of the Village of Winnetka duly passed, and is further authorized by an election duly called and held.

The Village of Winnetka shall have the right by six (6) months' notice printed in any newspaper of general circulation in said County of Cook, Illinois, bonds upon payment of principal and interest thereon to date, the serial numbers of the bonds redeemed to be selected by lot.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuing of this bond have been done, happened and been performed in regular and due form as required by law, and that the total indebtedness of the Village of Winnetka, including this bond,

does not exceed the statutory or constitutional limitations. IN WITNESS WHEREOF, The Village of Winnetka, Illinois, has caused this bond to be sealed with its corporate seal, signed by its President, attested by its Village Clerk, and countersigned by its Village Treasurer, and has caused the annexed interest coupons to be executed with the facsimile signatures of the said officers this first day of July, 1927.

SECTION 3. No part of the proceeds of the bonds hereby authorized shall be expended unless and until there has been an appropriation therefrom duly made by the Village Council prior to such expenditures, stating the specific object or purpose for which the same is to be expended.

SECTION 4. For the purpose of providing for the payment of the principal and interest of the bonds hereby authorized, as the payments severally become due, there shall be and there is hereby levied and there shall be collected a direct tax upon all the taxable property in the Village of Winnetka, Illinois, sufficient to produce the following sums for the following years:

The bonds authorized by this ordinance shall not be issued unless this ordinance is approved at a special election to be called and held on the eleventh day of June, 1927.

The question of the approval of the foregoing ordinance shall appear on the ballot at said election in substantially the following form:
