

Dick Hanley, N. U. Grid Coach, Ill With Appendicitis

Dick Hanley, Northwestern's new football coach, took ill Tuesday with a chronic attack of appendicitis which confined him to his bed in the North Shore hotel. Dr. M. A. Hobart, university physician, went into consultation with Dr. William A. Parkes and decided that Hanley should undergo an operation.

Due to his desire to attend the football schedule-making conference at Madison today, Coach Hanley was reluctant to submit to an operation until later. Dr. Hobart kept in constant attendance upon the patient with the purpose of operating if necessary.

Coach Hanley has had frequent attacks of appendicitis in the past but none so severe as he suffered Tuesday. Acting upon the advice of his physicians he will submit to the operation at this time in order to eliminate any chance of taking ill during the football season.

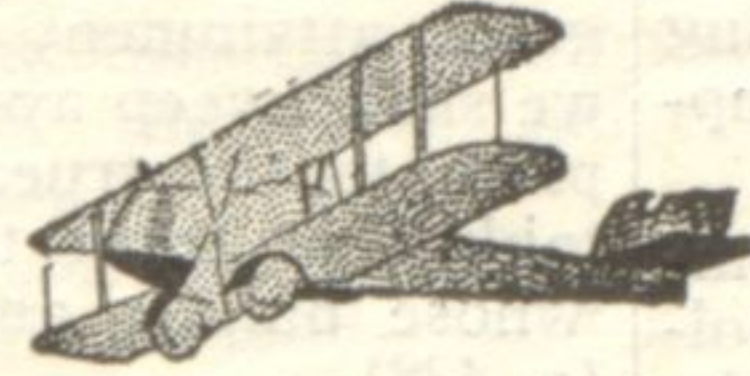
