

ASK VOTERS TO FAVOR WAR VETS' CEMETERY

Proposition to Establish Burial Place in Forest Preserves on Ballot June 6

The proposed Cook county War Veterans Memorial cemetery will be the greatest cemetery in the world, according to Capt. Robert R. Raap, of the William McKinley camp, United Spanish War Veterans, who is chairman of the War Veterans' committee backing the project.

According to Capt. Raap, the cemetery will be at least one mile square, located in one of the primeval woods of the County Forest Preserve. It will in sheer beauty surpass the National Military cemetery at Arlington after which it will be modeled, he asserts.

Plan Twelve Terraces

The cemetery will be divided into twelve terraces rising back the whole mile in depth. There will be no individual monuments to break the harmony of the plan, as each grave will be marked only with a standard headstone and the Private will receive as big a headstone as that of a Major General.

The only monuments allowed in the cemetery will be a scarce half dozen as memorials to the hero dead of our various wars. All monuments, headstones, buildings and fences will be of one general design, to blend in with the forest in which it will be located.

On Judicial Ballot

This proposition will come before the voters of Cook county on a special ballot at the judicial election of June 6. It must carry a majority of all the votes cast in that particular election.

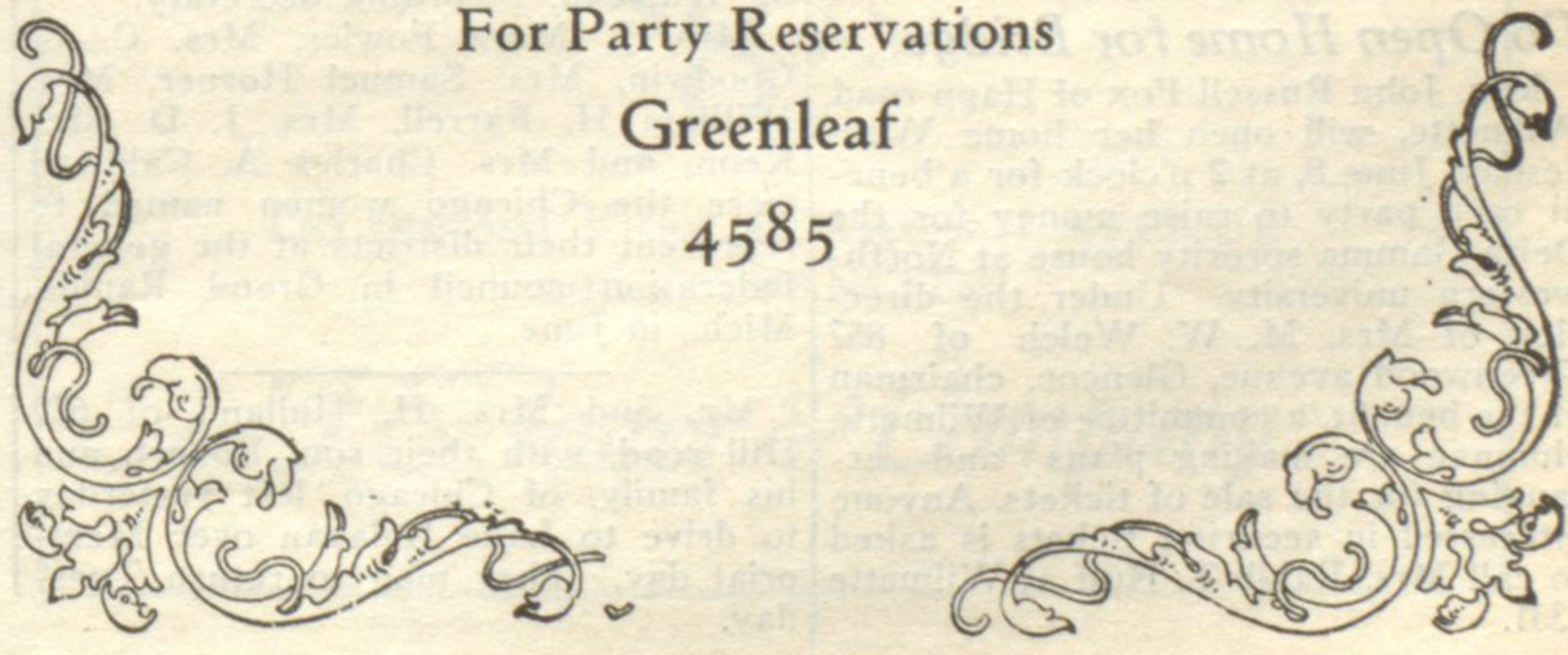
