- The program of dances which followed was given in the ballroom on the third floor by Mrs. W. J. Webb, assisted by Charles Eastman, Russell Locke, Charles Simpson, James Rod-

gers, and William Ayer McKinney, with Mrs. Donald Morrison at the piano.

Mrs. Webb opened with a number consisting of extracts from five national dances, Scottish, Irish, English, Dutch, and American. The perfection of grace and rythm displayed in Mrs. Webb's dancing elated the audience with a fresh sense of the talent which seems to naturally gravitate to Winnetka from the four quarters of the globe, by virtue of which it has been said that one can find in Winnetka someone to do anything if one but look long enough.

The original ballet "Spring," performed by the five men fulfilled not to say exceeded, all expectations. It had all the humor of a college boy's burlesque enhanced by the added years and avoirdupois. The ecstasies of the dancers on hearing the song of the cuckoo in the tree, and conspicuously Mr. Eastman's endeavor to imitate the flight of the bird, were greatly appreciated by the audience.

Mrs. Webb closed the program with a Spanish dance, followed by an English Country jig, the dance in which she coached Dorothy Gish for the film "Nell Gwynne." Refreshments and dancing followed.

That the evening was an enjoyable one was evidenced by the reluctance of the participants to leave and by several interested inquiries as to when the next party would be given.
