 FRIDAY—Cherry st. to Westmoor rd.
 SATURDAY—Westmoor rd. to north limits.

Dr. Gilbert M. Loewe was summoned and dressed his injuries, which, at first it was feared included a fracture of the skull, but later proved to be less serious and he is recovering.

Warner had fallen from a truck driven by Anthony Montanaro, of 519 Kenilworth avenue. He was sitting in the rear of the truck and is thought to have fallen asleep enroute.
