TO LOCARNO MEETING Hubbard Woods Faculty


Superintendent Washburne and Ten Teachers from Winnetka Schools to Attend Educational Conference

Ten teachers from the Winnetka schools will attend the World Conference of New Education which will be held in Locarno, Switzerland, this summer between August 3 and August 15. In addition to these Superintendent Carleton Washburne will address the conference on the evening of August 8 upon the subject "Freedom Through Individual Mastery." On the mornings of August 10 and 11 he will also speak on the new science of education.

The Locarno conference is the fourth international conference of the New Educational Fellowship. The preceding meetings, which have been held during the past few years, were held in France, French Switzerland, and Germany and one of the chief reasons for holding the coming conference in Locarno is that it is in Italian Switzerland and is Italian in language and atmosphere. Through the associations there it is hoped that a closer bond of fellowship with the Swiss and Italian educators will be achieved.

The true meaning of freedom in education will be the principal theme of the conference and it is the prime aim to discover the "Art of Freedom," both for the child and the teacher, as it is contended that new methods and many theories are useless in education if the teacher himself has not attained a measure of inner freedom. Educators from all over the world of international fame will comprise the speakers at the conference.

Hayes, Greeley school; Marion Elwell, acting principal of the Horace Mann school; Luella Swartz, Florence Fake, Rose Danberg, Catherine Smith, Ruth E. Danberg, Eva Cox, and Marion Carswell of the Hubbard Woods school; and Mr. and Mrs. Frank L. Bailey of the Skokie school. Miss Carswell will remain at Locarno throughout the coming year.
