July 2 Deadline for War Risk Insurance

The American Legion National headquarters warns all ex-service men that the final date for reinstating or converting War Risk insurance is July 2, 1927.

"This insurance cannot be equalled by other insurance companies for the same amount of money and every ex-service man owes it to himself, his family and his community to reinstate as much as possible of this insurance before it is too late," the statement reads.

"The Association of Insurance companies has endorsed this insurance and recommends that every man eligible take advantage of the provision of the law," it continues.

"The zero hour is midnight July 1."

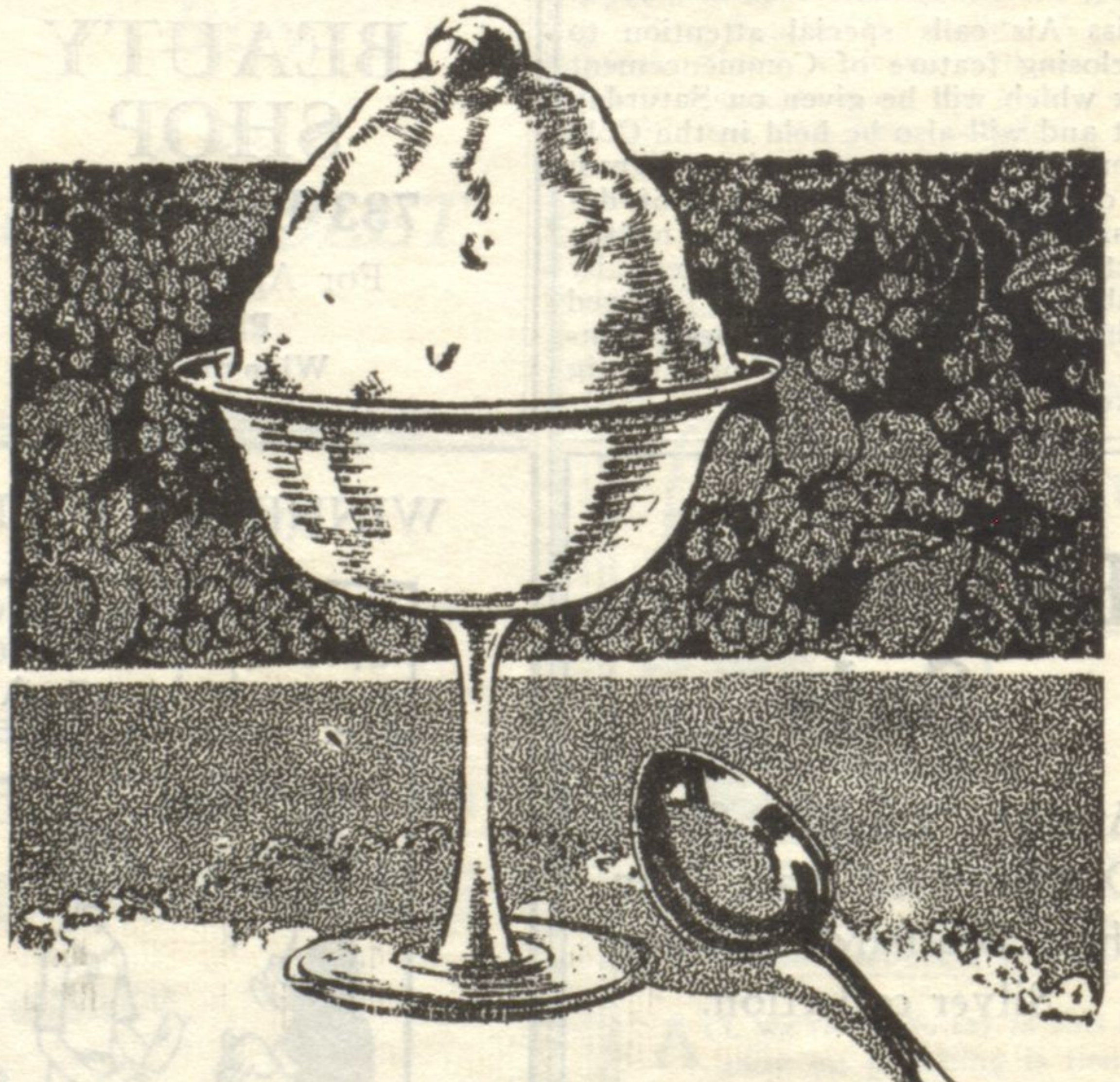
