

PLAYFIELD CONTINUES TO DRAW BIG ENTRIES

Tournaments Arranged for Current Season Promise Best Year in History of Course

The two tournaments scheduled for the Skokie Playfield Golf course the past week maintained the record of attendance set at the opening events the preceding week.
