Blatchford Bequeaths Home to Congregational Church

The will of the late Nathaniel Hopkins Blatchford, Sr., of Wilmette, who died June 13, has been filed in the Cook County Probate court by the Chicago Title and Trust company, executor, disposes of an estate estimated at \$135,000.

The principal bequest is the gift of his home at 325 Ridge avenue, Wilmette, to the Congregational church of Wilmette of which he was a member; to be held as the "N. Hopkins and Helen W. Blatchford Endowment" for the maintenance and upkeep of the Wilmette Community House.

Other bequests are \$5,000 each to the seven grandchildren: Ella Marion Blatchford Berry, Elsie Larned Blatchford, Francis W. Blatchford, Jr., Walter Larned Blatchford, Nathaniel H. Blatchford, III, Frederick Kent Blatchford and Nicholas Blatchford.

Miss Emma Olena Simonsen, his housekeeper, is bequeathed \$15,000. The rest of the estate is divided between his two sons, Dr. Francis W. Blatchford and Nathaniel Hopkins Blatchford, Jr.

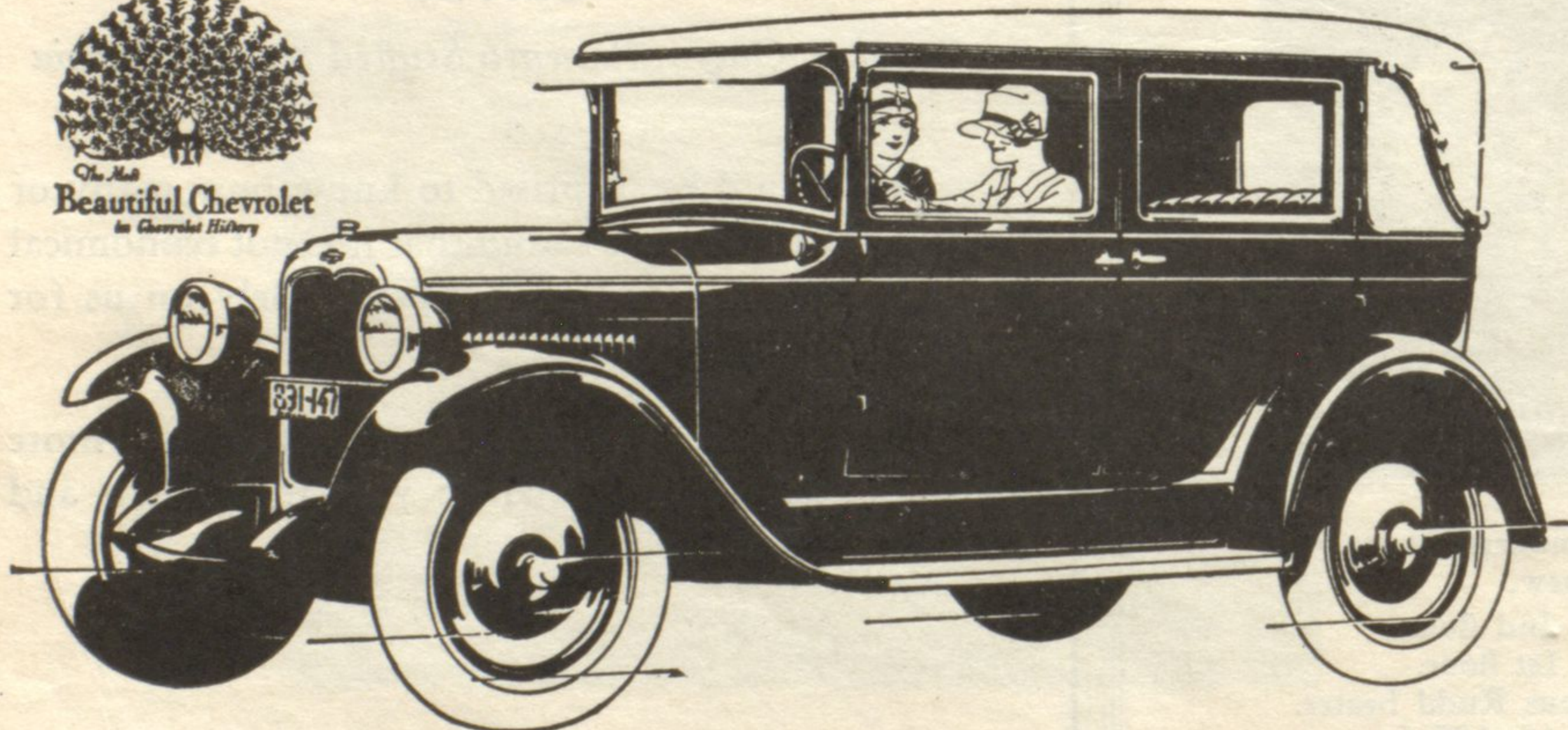
