Dedicate Village Theatre Organ

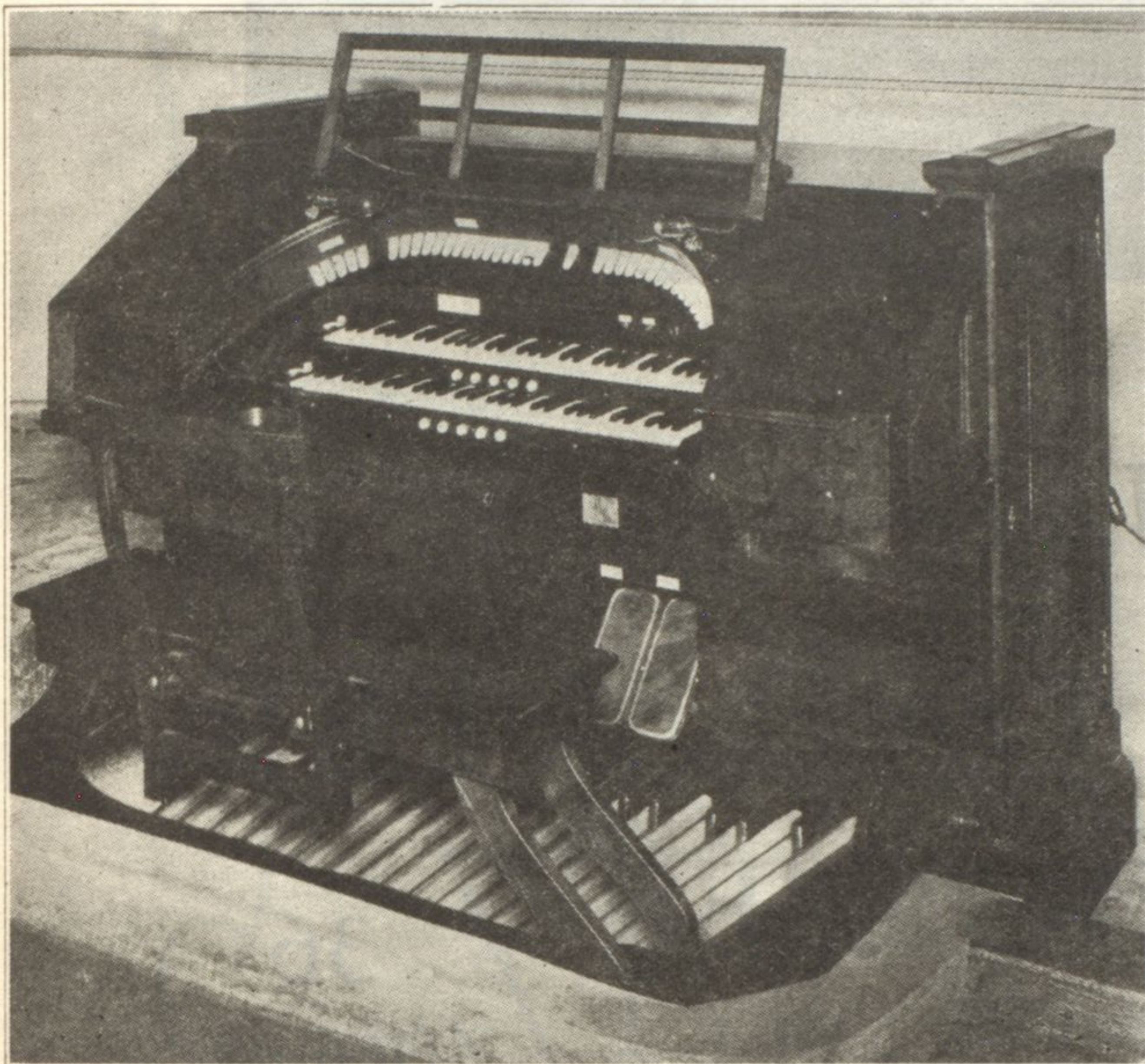

Quicksands and Slide Kelly at Village Theatre
