WOMEN IN TITLE PLAY

North Shore Golf Club to Be Scene of Chicago District Event of Women's Western Golf Association

The Chicago district Women's Western Golf association, is to have its championship tournament at the North Shore Golf club from Monday, July 11, to Friday, July 15, inclusive. Virginia Van Wie, the district champion, will be title defendant, and other entrants will include many prominent women golfers of Chicago and suburbs.

Practice opened on the course Wednesday, with fifteen players trying out the course. Mrs. Fleming of Beverly Hills turned in the best score, 93. Among the players who will enter the tournament will be Mrs. Lee Mida of Butterfield, who holds the course with a record of a 90, which Janet Byrnes of the North Shore club and a resident of Wilmette, nearly equalled once with a 92.

The schedule of events for the five day tourney has been arranged as follows:

Monday, July 11, at 9 in the morning, 18 holes of medal play; prize for low gross, three additional flights of sixteen to qualify.

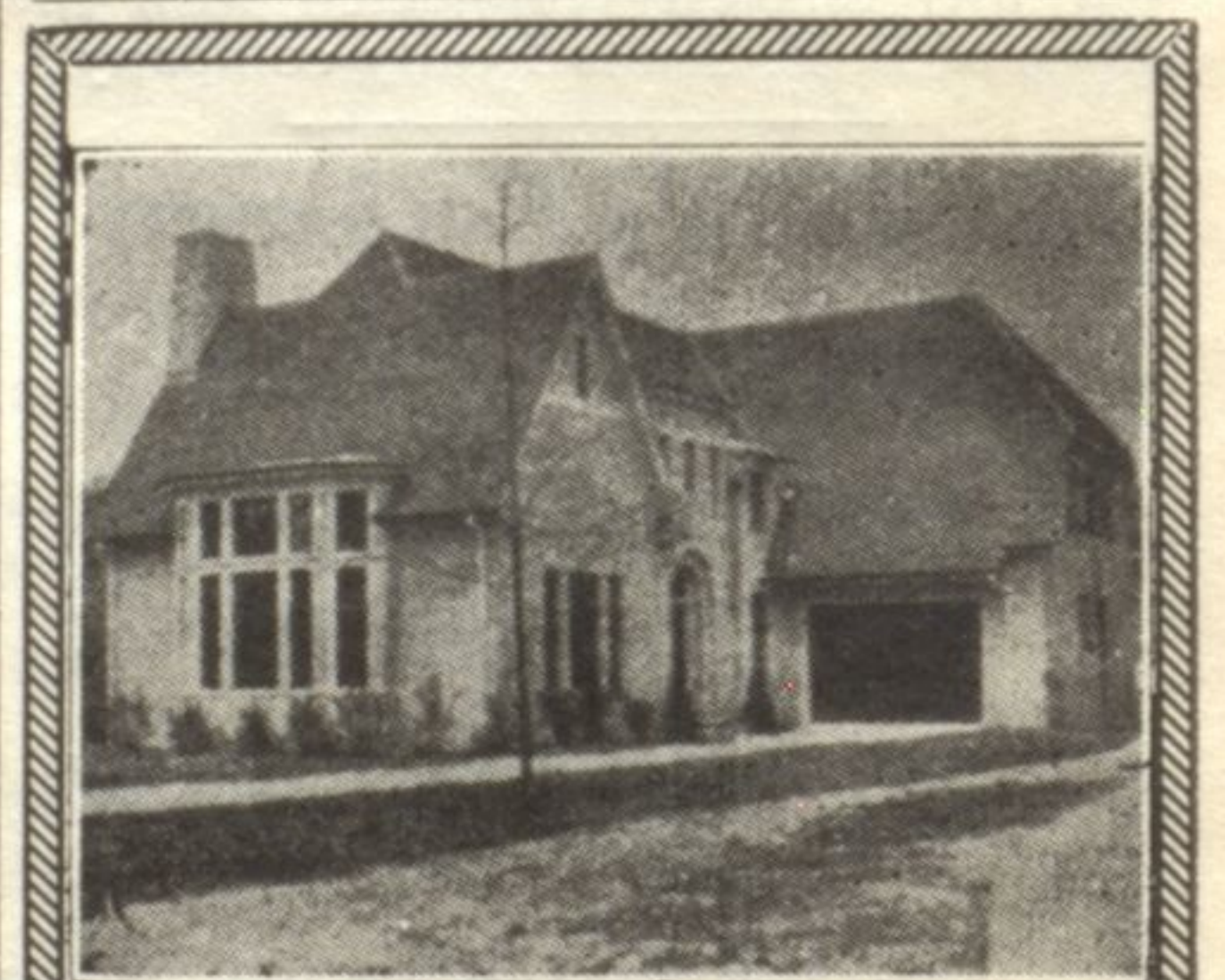
Tuesday, at 9, first round of match for championship and other flights; 10 o'clock, consolation handicap, 18 holes for all who failed to qualify, prizes for low gross, low net; at 2 in the afternoon, driving contest for classes A, B, and C.

Wednesday at 9, second round of match play and other flights; first round match play consolation for all flights; at 1 o'clock, four ball foursome handicap, 9 holes, prizes for best ball, low gross and low net.

Thursday, at 9, semi-final match play for all flights; second round match play consolation for all flights; at 12, mixed foursome, prizes for low gross and low net.

Friday at 9, final of all flights.
