## Girls Ahead of Boys in Use of Tongues, Scientists Assert

Tests given in the Institute of Child Welfare at the University of Minnesota have proved girls consistently ahead of boys in knowledge and use of language.

This information was given his audience at the National Kindergarten and Elementary College by Prof. John E. Anderson, head of the institute, when he spoke there last Thursday afternoon.

The child, he reminded, is not a miniature man, mentally or physically, and one of the greatest tasks undertaken by the various child welfare research stations is that of finding out just what a child really is and how he develops. The several investigations conducted along this line by the Institute were described by Prof. Anderson.

In the institute's study of the development of language it has been discovered that the greatest part of the child's language development has been done by the time he is five years of age.

"This being the case," the speaker concluded, "we should be training parents to expose their children to the correct use of language, by example, when they are from two to five years old, rather than allowing them to develop slipshod habits of speech which second, third and fourth grade teachers must spend their time in breaking.
