APPROPRIATE \$77,200 Women Escape Injury

Kenilworth Village Board Passes Bill Providing for Municipal Expenditures in Next Fiscal Year

The annual Appropriations ordinance, providing for a total of \$77,200 to be used by the Village of Kenilworth for the expenses of the fiscal year, was passed by the Kenilworth Village board at its regular meeting held last Tuesday evening.

The water supply committee was also authorized by the board to proceed with arrangements with Pearse, Greeley and Hanson, engineers, to have plans drawn up for the proposed new Kenilworth water works.

The various funds provided for in the ordinance are as follows: Fire department, \$4,500; police department salaries, \$18,500; police department current expenses, \$3,500; health department, \$1,000; street labor, \$6,500; street material, \$2,000; street lighting, \$8,000; snow removal, \$1,000; garbage removal, \$5,500; rent, \$700.

Furniture and fixtures, \$300; general office expenses, \$1,240; election expenses, \$700; salaries and clerical help, \$6,500; insurance and fidelity bonds, \$1,500; legal expenses \$3,500; real estate, \$775; interest on general special assessments against village fund bonds, \$2,285; principal on general fund bonds, \$3,500; other general expenses, \$3,500.
