However, he has hopes of several aspiring sophomores stepping into regular assignments.

Coach Hanley anticipates his main problem as developing a pair of ends that will be able to perform creditably. Waldo Fisher, the lone regular varsity end will be back to take care of one assignment. Developing of tackles and centers will be another chief job up to the Purple mentor.

Northwestern faces the toughest schedule in its history. The Purple opens with South Dakota on Oct. 1 and on the following Saturday meets Utah, one of the strongest teams in the West last fall. Then comes the strong Ohio State and Illinois games on successive Saturdays. After these tilts the Wildcats will buck up against the husky Missouri outfit.
