Fairyland Tale

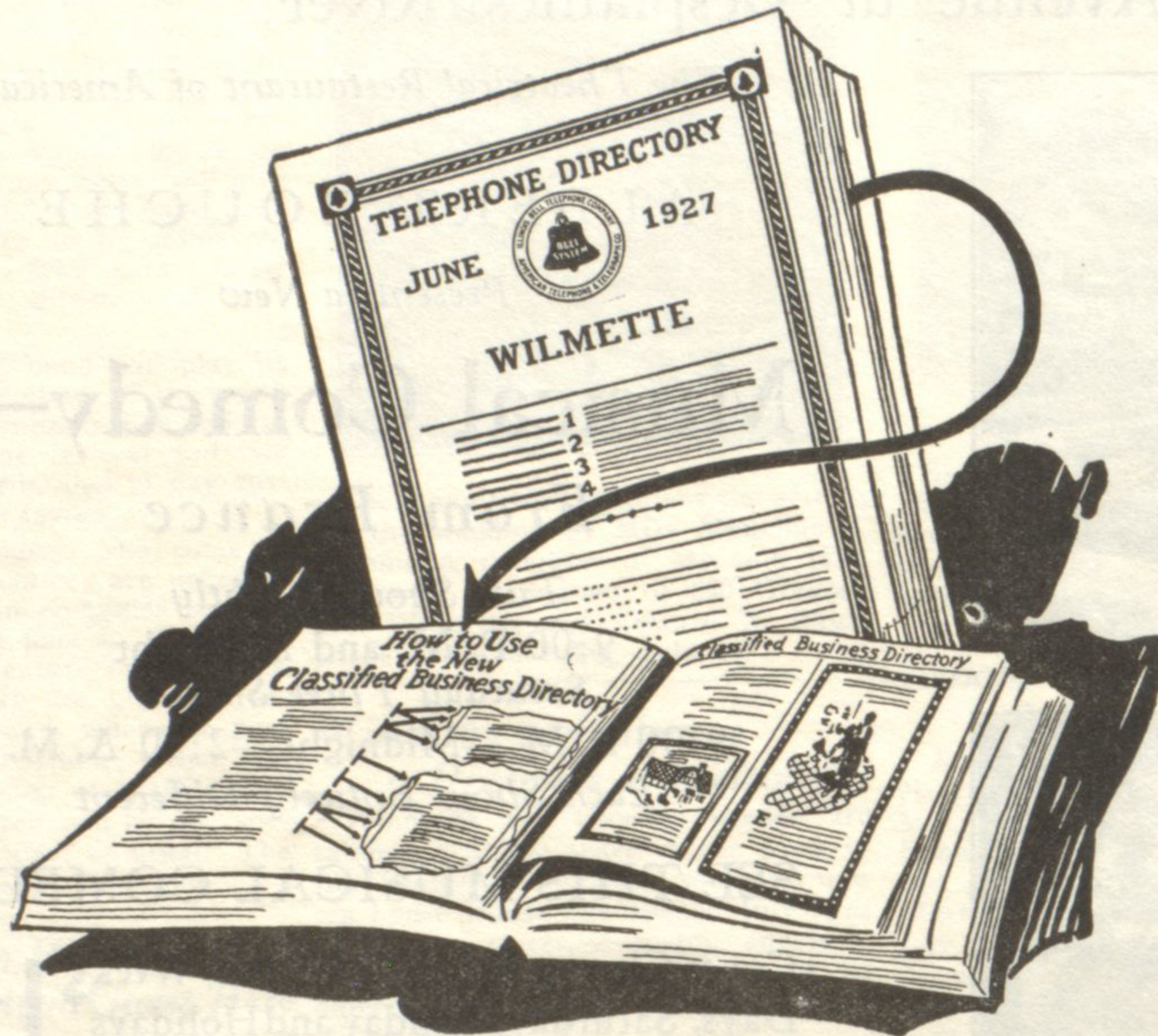
