

LAY BATTLE PLANS IN WAR ON SKEETER

North Shore Communities Joined Together as District 1 in Fight on Pest

New Trier communities and areas to the west have been joined together with Evanston as District 1 in the newest campaign to rid the suburban areas of Chicago of the mosquito nuisance.

Initial action under the unified scheme will start next week with a meeting in Evanston of representatives of all of the north shore. Since the passage of the new state law, six mosquito abatement districts were established tentatively by the committee on plans called by the Gorgas Memorial institute, an endowed organization in Chicago for advising in matters concerning public health.

The District 1 section extends from Howard street north to the county line and west from the lake front to Milwaukee avenue.

Because certain preliminary steps are necessary before the actual operation of mosquito abatement under the new law, a meeting has been called at the office of John Hahn, Inc., in Evanston.

Arthur C. Stringer, secretary of the Gorgas Memorial, is a resident of the north shore, now living in Glencoe.
