Horse Jumping Exhibition by North Shore Riders Gives Unusual Touch to Winnetka Day Program

Probably the outstanding event of the entire Winnetka Day program was the horse jumping exhibition which was given by four of the North Shore's nnest horsemen, John Harnett, Frank Moffitt, C. Otto Ruess and "Chick' Johnson, riding some of the best horses in this country. Costumed in the bright crimson coats, white breeches and boots typical of the sport in old England, the riders added an unusual finishing touch to the afternoon's program as with their mounts they presented a brilliant exhibition of horsemanship, and barrier jumping.

The program, which was presented through the courtesy of the Harnett and Moffitt riding stables in association with Messrs Johnson and Ruess, was arranged by the committee in charge of the celebration as something entirely different from the usual run of events for a like occasion. That it was a decided success in the eyes of the public was clearly set out by the spontaneous and whole hearted expressions of appreciation for the skill of mounts and riders.

Mr. Harnett, who was associated with the Indian Hill Riding club as the club riding master but who is now the owner of the Harnett stables, presented a string of three horses. The first of these, Melwood, has been the winner of over 40 first prizes in jumping contests throughout the United States and was the winner of the national championship at Denver recently. 
