

UNKNOWN MAN HANGS SELF ON BILLBOARD

Signet Ring Bearing Initials "J. P." Sole Clue to Identity of Suicide

The morgue of the Lewis funeral parlors on Central avenue, Wilmette, this week received the body of an unidentified man who, sometime early Sunday morning, took his own life by hanging himself to a bill board on 15th street, north of Elmwood avenue, at the north limits of Wilmette. The body had not been identified early Thursday morning. An inquest into the death scheduled for Tuesday morning of this week was postponed until Tuesday morning, August 30, pending identification.

Two possible clues to identification of the man failed of fruition early this week. He was at first partially identified as one Henry Fisher, a gardener, employed by various families in Wilmette. This proved wrong when the gardener in question appeared at his accustomed tasks Tuesday.

A second clue came to naught after a Chicago woman, learning that the initials on a signet ring in the possession of the dead man tallied with those of a long lost brother, failed to identify the remains.

Motorists Discover Body

The man is described as of medium height, fair complexion, auburn hair and heavy auburn mustache, and of about middle age. He wore a black suit and tie and gray fedora hat with fancy striped band. The hat showed the firm name of the Big Ben store at 1463 Milwaukee avenue, Chicago. A signet ring bore the initials "J. P." His shirt bore the laundry mark "T." An Ashland avenue, Chicago, surface line transfer dated Sunday, August 21, was found in a trouser pocket. That and

the ring comprised the extent of the possessions on the body.

The body was discovered Sunday morning at 10:30 o'clock by E. E. Nougle and G. E. Mitchell of Rogers Park who were passing along 15th street in a car. Wilmette police were notified and the body removed to the Lewis undertaking parlors.

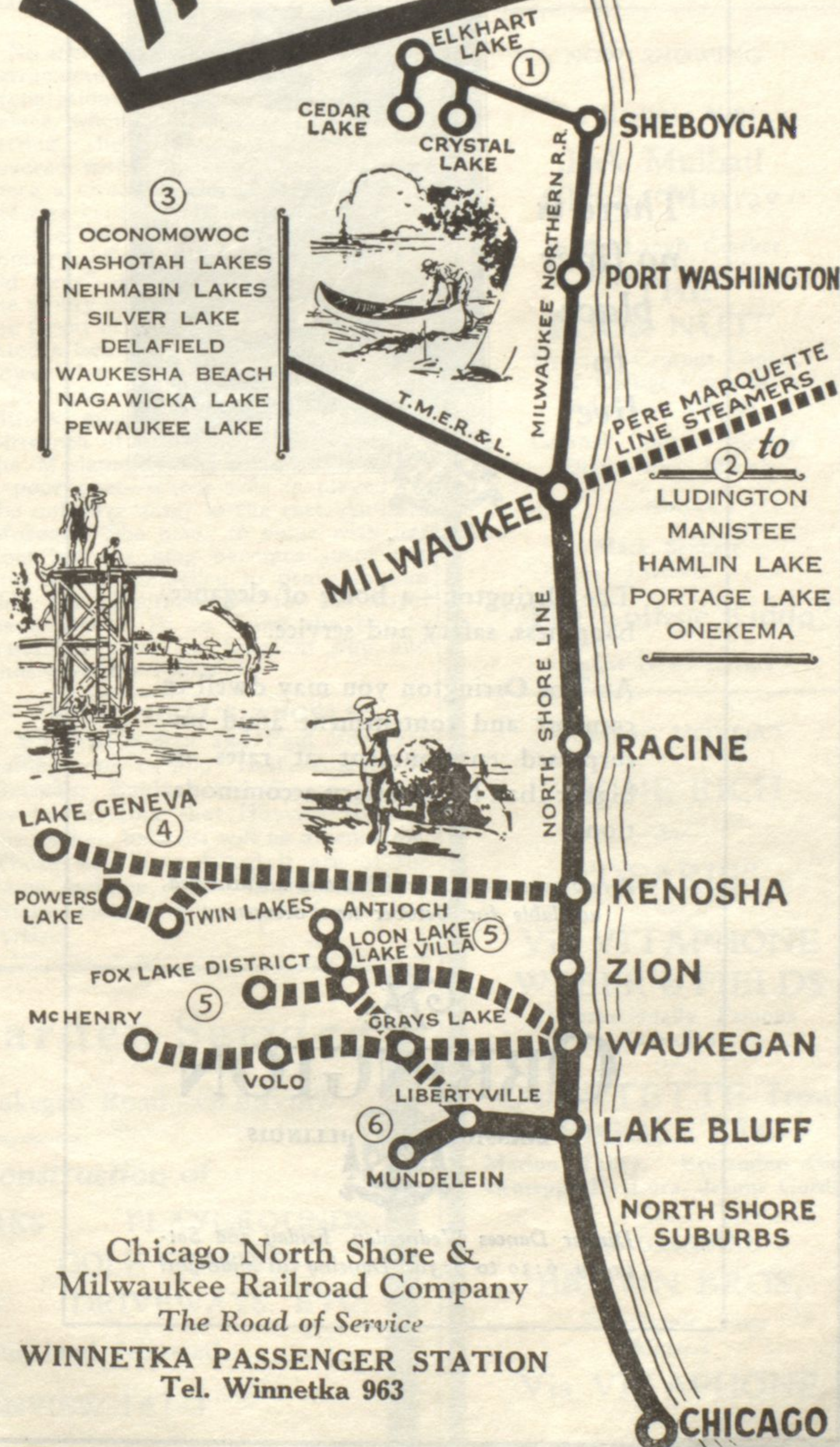

1. Elkhart Lake, Cedar Lake, Crystal Lake, Sheboygan, Port Washington: Take North Shore Line to Milwaukee; connections at door of our Milwaukee terminal with Milwaukee Northern trains for these points.

2. Michigan points—Ludington, Manistee, Hamlin Lake, Portage Lake, Onkema: Take North Shore Line to Milwaukee; Pere Marquette night steamer from there; arrive Michigan next morning. Through tickets.

3. Oconomowoc, Nashotah Lakes, Nehmabin Lakes, Silver Lake, Delafield, Waukesha Beach, Nagawicka Lake, Pewaukee Lake: Take North Shore Line to Milwaukee—step into T. M. E. R. & L. trains at door of our Milwaukee terminal, for these points. Through tickets.
