**Pickwick Suburban Golf**

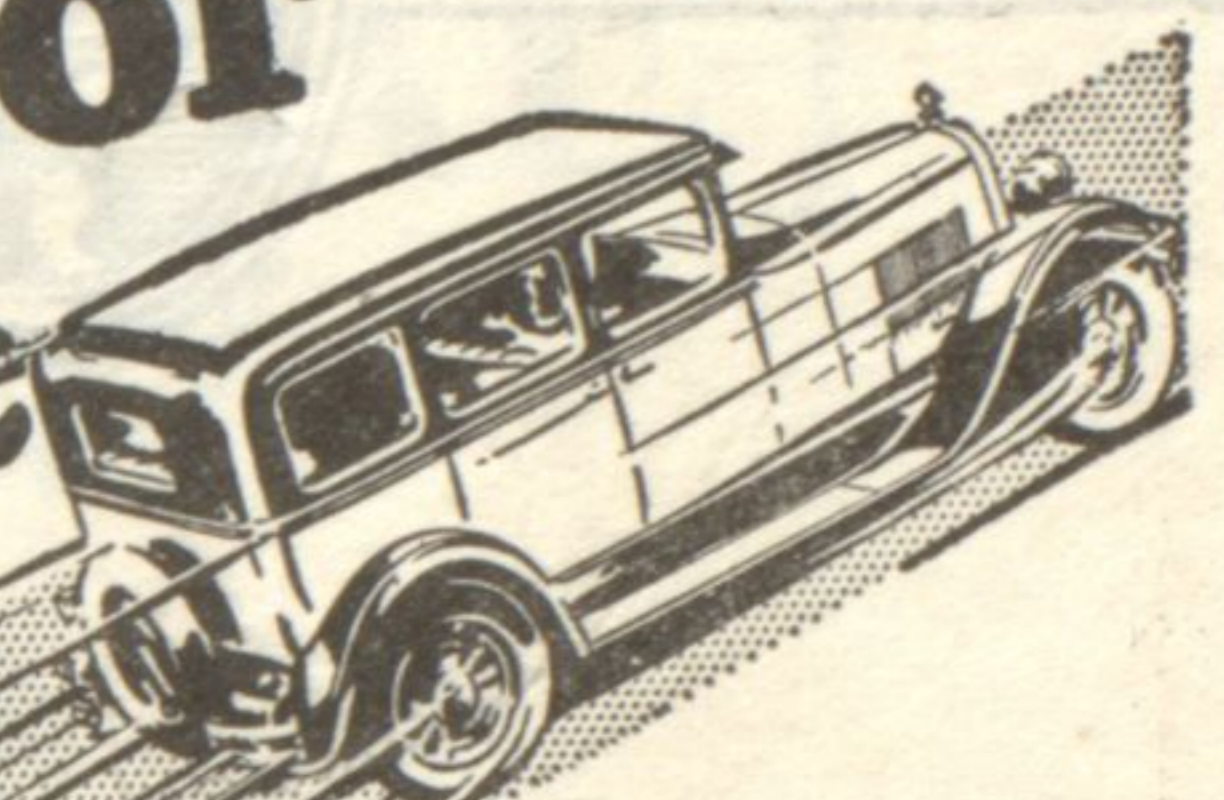
The third of the series of bi-weekly exhibition golf matches being staged by the Pickwick Suburban Golf club
