AL WINS PRO TITLE

Illinois Professional Club Championship Goes to Al Espinosa After Close Finals With George Arnold

There is jubilation and much of it at the Illinois Golf club. It is because Al Espinosa, the club's professional, who has been "knocking at the door" for several years, crashed through last week and registered a most notable triumph in capturing the championship of the Illinois Professional club. To win the championship Espinosa was forced to set a killing pace for his opponent, George Arnold, in the finals. Arnold, the Westmoreland clubmaker, played to average par figures for the thirty holes played but Espinosa won 8 and 6.

Espinosa has won other championships, and his latest victory enabled him to carry to his home club the big silver cup which goes to the winner. The tournament just finished was played at Glen Acres.

Espinosa never played more wonderful golf. Right from the start he drove, approached and putted in uncanny fashion. Arnold, who gained fame seven or eight years ago by being a runner-up in the French Open also was playing great golf as is indicated by the fact that he played to par figures in the morning round of the 36 hole final. But par opposition meant little to Espinosa, for he had the Westmoreland man 2 down at lunch time.

Then followed the abbreviated afternoon round and more deadly work by Espinosa. Arnold was only two strokes over par in the afternoon play but in spite of his good shooting Espinosa picked up hole after hole and at the twelfth green had the Westmoreland player down five more, the match ending there.
