Village Schedules Jack and Charlie on Double Program

A double feature program, presenting "Manhattan Madness" with Jack Dempsey, and Charlie Chaplin's "Shoulder Arms," will be shown at the Village theater next Friday and Saturday. In the former, Jack and his wife, known on the screen as Estelle Taylor, are co-starred. The scenes are laid in the west and in New York City. Dempsey has the role of a young westerner on his first trip to the city, who finds Manhattan pretty dull until he becomes involved in a mystery surrounding his apparent kidnaping of the girl with whom he has fallen in love.

Of course, "Shoulder Arms" needs no re-introduction.

"His Dog" will be the attraction for Monday and Tuesday. Joseph Schildkraut plays as a slovenly farmer—a down-and-outer—who is regenerated through the love of his dog.

Opposite Schildkraut in the leading feminine role is Julia Faye. Olga Printzlau adapted "His Dog" for the screen from Albert Payson Terhune's widely-read magazine serial of the same name. Walter Woods supervised the production.

"Dearie," a Warner Bros. production, starring Irene Rich, and directed by Archie Mayo, comes on Wednesday and Thursday. Miss Rich is cast as "Dearie," hostess of a Broadway night club and mother of a boy whom she is keeping in college without letting him know the source of his income. He is a conceited lad with a couple of pals who are spenders and the three are finally expelled. There is a pretty little co-ed, gigolos, matinee ladies, rich men, poor men—thrills and merriment with a note of tragedy.
