"Twas a mystery!

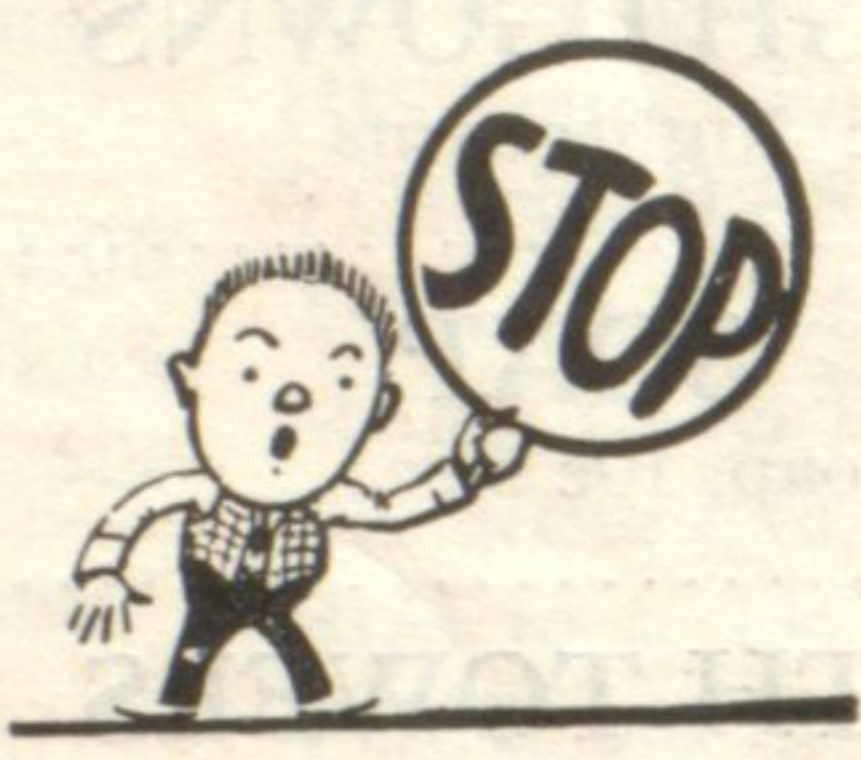
Had the wearer disrobed and then drowned herself?
