**Concert Singer Added
to Music School Staff**

An addition to the Music School faculty of Northwestern university is announced this week by Prof. Loyal Phillips Shawe, head of the department of voice—Miss Mima Montgomery, a former pupil of Lili Lehmann and Franz Emerich in Berlin, and formerly head of the department of voice at Wellesley college.

Miss Montgomery has recently returned from an engagement with the National Stats opera at Munich. She is a graduate of the New England Conservatory of Music at Boston and has had extensive concert and oratorio work in America, appearing with both the Boston and San Francisco Symphony orchestras. After spending considerable time with the American Red Cross in Europe during the World War, she became a member of the faculty of the college of the Pacific at Stockton, California. Later she became head of the department of voice at Wellesley and then spent time studying and appearing in Europe.

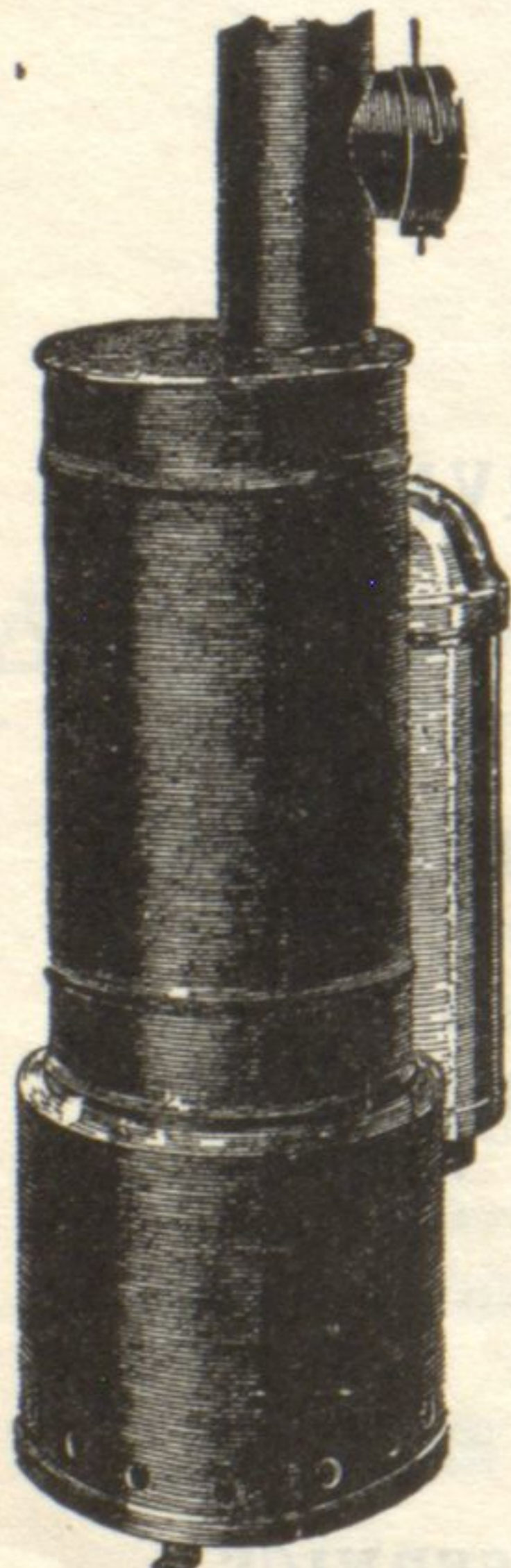
