

KENILWORTH MAN MADE COLONEL IN KENTUCKY

Harry P. Harrison, Leader in Chautauqua Activity Honored by Governor Fields

Harry P. Harrison, 306 Abbottsford road, Kenilworth, Ill., has been honored by having conferred upon him by Gov. William J. Fields of Kentucky a colonelcy on the governor's staff. This honor was conferred because of the educational services of Col. Harrison in Kentucky in his capacity as manager of the Redpath Chautauqua, Chicago. For 14 years between forty and fifty Kentucky cities have had Redpath Chautauquas annually.

In a statement under the caption, "Howdy, Colonel Harrison," and relating to the honor bestowed upon the Kenilworth man, Thomas B. McGregor, former attorney general of Kentucky, had the following to say about Col. Harrison:

"If you want to know how an honest-to-goodness—simon pure—all wool and a yard wide Kentucky colonel feels, just ask Col. Harry P. Harrison, manager of the Redpath bureau, because when he comes South next spring with his Seven Day, Atlantic and Gulf circuits, he will be greeted by his fellow compatriots down this way: 'By gad, suh, Colonel Harrison, how are yuh?'"

"By the authority invested by the Constitution and Laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Gov. William J. Fields has issued the proper commission under the great seal of the staff of the governor, who is Commander and Chief of Army and Navy of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, with the rank of colonel. Under the Laws of Kentucky, distinguished persons who have rendered distinguished service to

the people of the Commonwealth may be appointed to this honorary position. It was called to the attention of Governor Fields that Colonel Harrison had been for some sixteen years or more bringing into the state noted lecturers, musical programs and entertainment features, serving some forty or fifty communities each year with Chautauqua and Lyceum, and thus in the private capacity of the Redpath bureau serving the people of Kentucky. The governor justly thought that some recognition of this valued service should be given, and he accordingly made the appointment.
