Early Growing Bulbs for Fall Planting

It is to the early growing spring flowers grown from bulbs planted during September and October that we must look for our first bit of spring cheer and brightness.

The most common but certain early spring flowers which come popping their heads thru as soon as the frost is out of the ground are the golden daffodils, crocuses, hyacinths and early tulips. These are followed by the more pretentious Darwin tulips and Iris. Then comes the gorgeous peonies which responds most successfully to September or early October planting.

The reason spring planting of peonies is inadvisable is the difficulty of handling the brittle roots after growth has started.

Plant Your Early Spring Garden

For the benefit of our many amateur gardeners, who may be planting bulbs for the first time be sure to begin planting early in October to enable the newly planted bulbs to establish good roots before the ground freezes, otherwise their growth will be retarded next spring.

The garden soil should be as well worked and fertilized as in the spring, also plenty of moisture must be given the bulbs after planting.

By fall planting of Iris and Peonies we are able to secure a wealth of very early bloom.

Peonies should not be moved after once planted unless it is an absolute necessity. In that case, moving should be done at a season of the year when little root disturbance results.

We should plan adequate winter protection after all planting as it takes a little time for most plants to become acclimated to new locations. New roots are susceptible to unevenness in temperature. Straw or manure is the best protection and also acts as a fertilizer.

Fall planting can be done much more leisurely than spring planting, as we all find springtime much too short in this section for all of the garden work to be done.

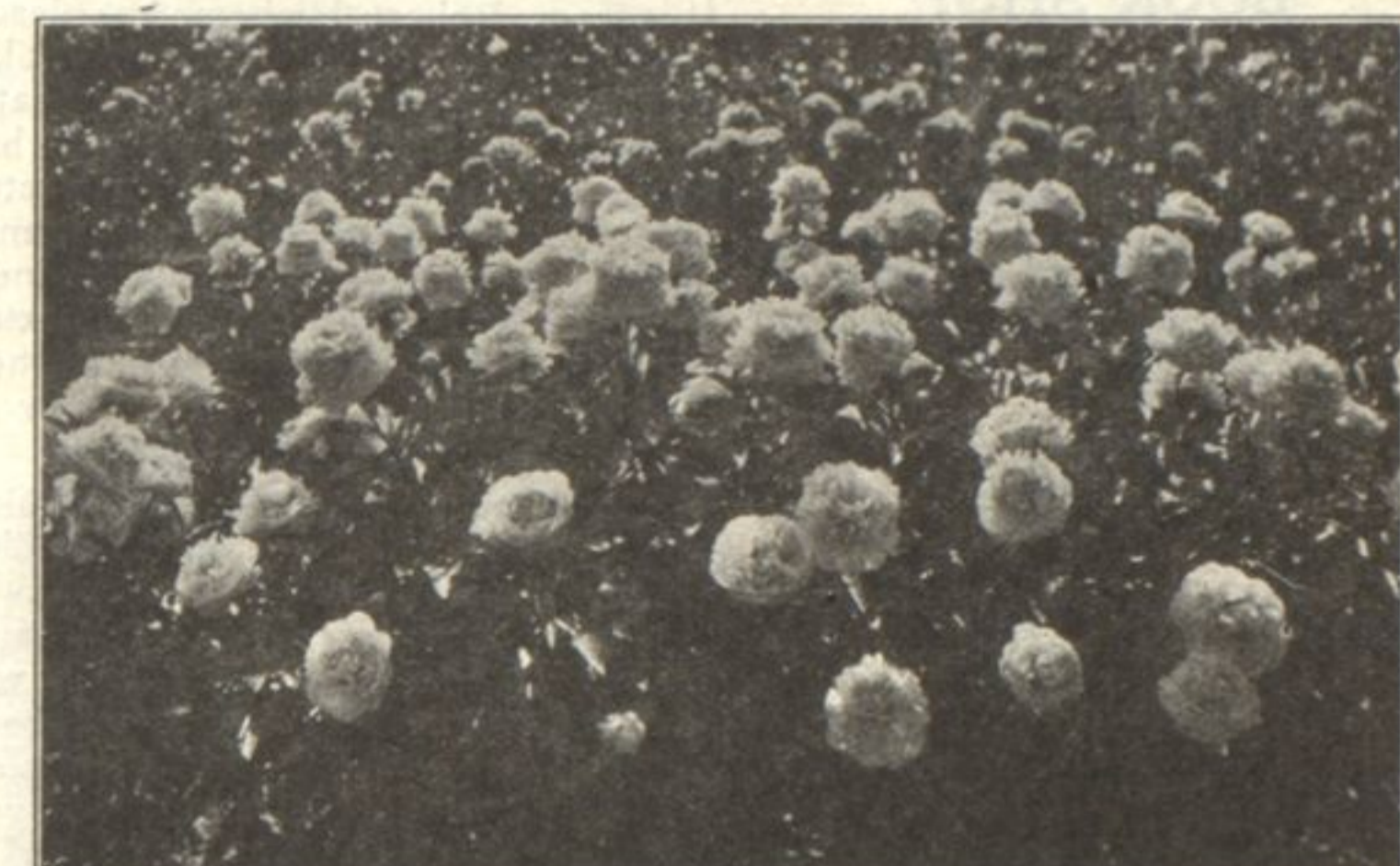
