RAPID TRAFFIC INCREASE

Recent extensive industrial development along the Skokie valley line of the Chicago, North Shore and Milwaukee railroad is being reflected in railway traffic, according to D. H. Howard, construction engineer of the North Shore line who has just completed a survey of conditions in this division of the road. Establishment of increased facilities for the handling of freight in carload lots is announced by officials of the railway. Joint tariffs have been arranged with steam roads, and arrangements for the exchange of freight are nearing completion.

"Holy Grail" Myth Said to Be Based Upon Irish Lore

The unexplained mysteries of the "Holy Grail" have been at least partially revealed by Dr. A. C. L. Brown, professor of English at Northwestern university, who has just returned from a six months' study of libraries in Dublin, Edinburgh, London and Paris.

Many scholars have attempted to construct a theory of the origin of the famous grail which figured so prominently in the legends of King Arthur and his round table. Doctor Brown obtained a leave of absence from his chair at Northwestern for the sole purpose of studying all available data on the grail and constructing a theory.

"In the original romances there is a large diversity of statements as to the nature and origin of the Holy Grail," Doctor Brown says. "A thousand years ago the Irish were great story tellers. My theory is that the legend was based on Irish stories. Study of old Gaelic manuscripts confirms my idea that the grail was of heathen and not Christian origin."

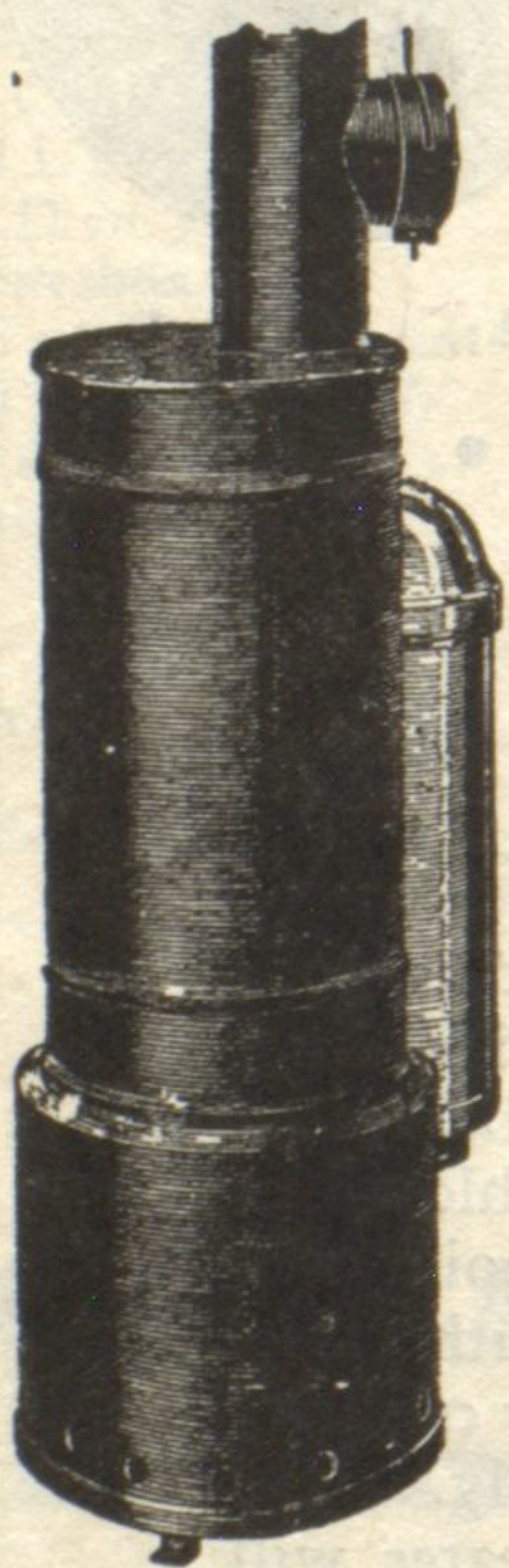
