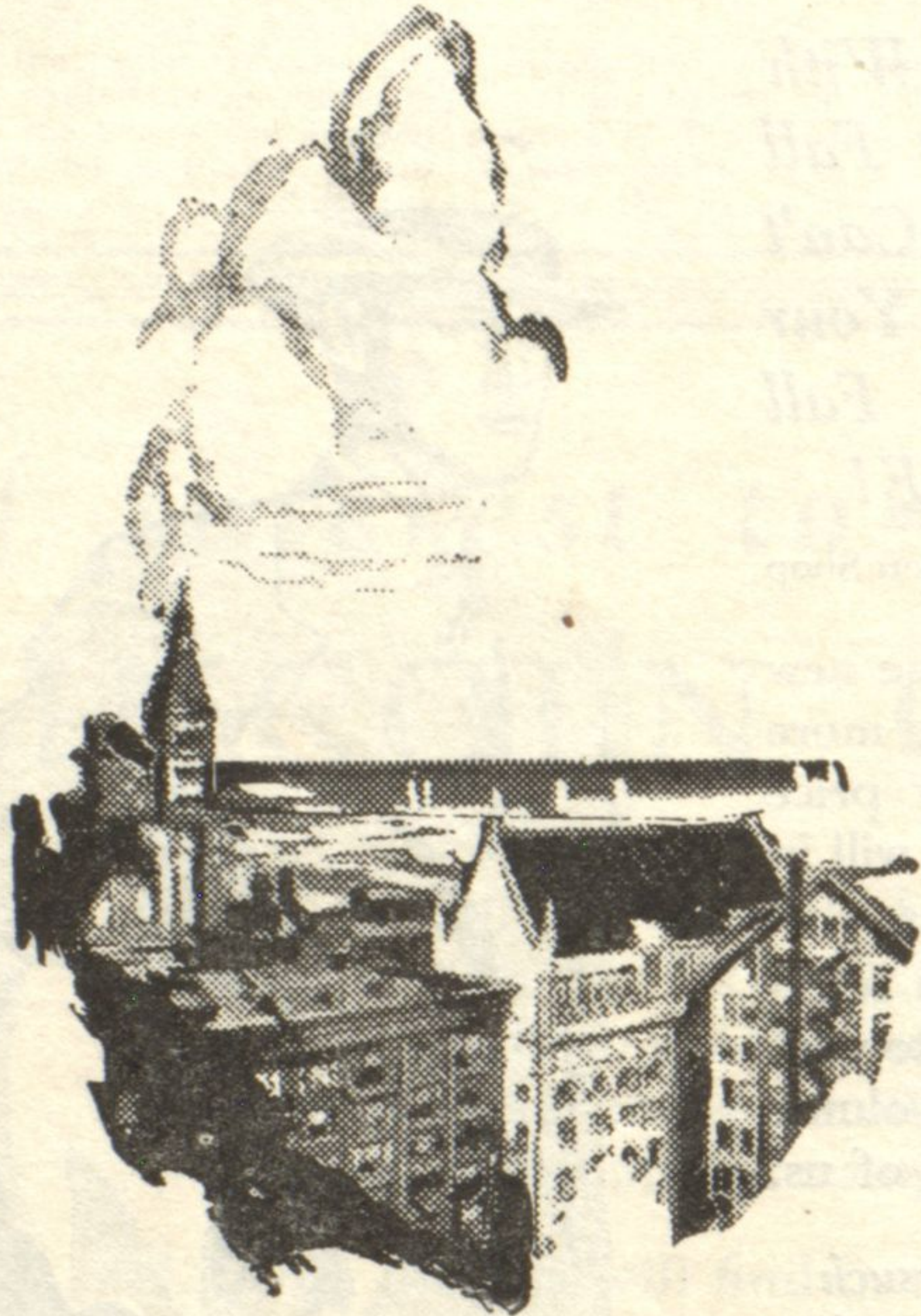

The letter, which bears the royal crest, acknowledges the note of condolence sent by Mr. Lusk. It will be remembered that this talented violinist has twice appeared by command before the late King Ferdinand and Queen Marie, and that only last May he was awarded the decoration of the Knight of the Roumanian Crown, one of the last decorations the king bestowed before his last illness.
